NEW LICENSES OR UPGRADES:

There were no new licenses or upgrades reported. **INTERESTING CON- TACTS:** Gregg Mulder/WB8LZG said he had worked 10 meters, which was wide open all over. He said it was so good that he could have easily worked 100 countries in a matter of hours. Erv/W8ERV reported that he had worked his first sweepstakes on 20 meters. He said that in 1 hour and 50 minutes he made 106 contacts (45 sections), which qualified him for a pin.

OLD BUSINESS: Before the

Secretary's report could be approved it had to be amended to make mention of the Secretary's inadvertent omission of her nomination of Bruce Rainey/KC8ODP in the November minutes. With the error corrected, Forrest Clark/N8PWD made a motion to accept the Secretary's report as amended. The motion was seconded by Currin Skutt/W8FSZ and approved. Don Devendorf/W8EGI made a motion to accept the Treasurer's report as printed in the Scope. The motion was seconded by Don Cote/KD8BD and approved.

NEW BUSINESS: Ham Fair Profits -Scott Newfer/W8SRN, LCDRA's Treasurer, presented CMARC with a check for \$770.51, which is our share of the Ham Fair profits. He also thanked everyone for making Ham Fair 2000 such a success and encouraged everyone to work hard to make 2001 even better. [Note: Those of us who worked on Ham Fair 2000 are still amazed at how well we profited, especially considering the fact that this was the first year in our new location, and with all the extra expenses such as: a costlier rental agreement because of the new, larger location; more advertisement; and the bigger and better prizes we had this year. It just goes to show that HARD WORK does pay off!! A big THANK YOU goes to each and every one of those that volunteered their time in working to make Ham Fair 2000 a huge success!]

Joint CMARC/MSU Amateur Radio Training Classes in 2001 - Gregg/WB8LZG addressed the membership and reported that MSU was, once again, interested in holding Amateur Radio license-training classes there. They said that everything had gone so well last winter, what with so many getting their first-time licenses and upgrades, that they

would be willing to go in on half of the cost of materials (all photo costs and overhead would be covered, once again, by MSU) and wondered if CMARC would be interested in going in on the other half to hold classes again this winter. After a brief discussion among the members, a motion was made by Gregg that CMARC should go in on half of the cost of materials. Gregg's motion was seconded by Currin/W8SFZ and approved.

B & B Embroidery Takes Orders -Dave Birdsley/KF8WS was on hand to take orders for hats, coats and shirts with the recently approved new Club logo. For the evening meeting only, Dave gave 20% off, if a minimum of 12 items were sold altogether in the evening's meeting. Nominations/Elections - Erv told the membership that he had asked Don Tillitson/WB8NUS, Forrest Clark/ N8PWD and Kay (Forrest's friend) to count the ballots for us. The membership accepted the choices. Erv then went over the list of November's nominees and ballots were passed out to the members for voting. Those nominated thus far were: (1.) LCDRA MEETING

OCTOBER 19, 2000

At 7:12 p.m., Clint/KC8EHR called the meeting to order. The following officers were present: Clint, Scott/W8SRN, and Hal/WA8LAY. Don/N8XME was excused. The following members were also present: Tom/KC8NJK, Jim/KA8DDQ, Don/W88NUS, Troy/W8TCC, Bruce/KC8ODP, Don/W8BQD, Dennis/KB8ZQZ, Roger/KC8CGH, and Doug/N8OBZ. Bill/KB8TTS, chair of the

CMARC/LCDRA Hamfair committee, was present. There were no new calls or vanity callsigns.

Clint/KC8EHR introduced Dennis/ KB8ZQZ to report on a proposal to erect two new repeaters on a commercial tower to be placed on the property of a sportsmen club located on the west side of Lansing. The Capital Area Sportsmen have made it known that they would like to have a public service organization place radio equipment on this tower so it can stay in place in the event that the cellphone company decides to abandon the site at a future date. Clint proposed that the new repeaters be dedicated to a Packet digipeater and an ARPS repeater. Presently, the closest digipeater for the QMN system, which services the Michigan traffic system, is located in Chelsea. Likewise, the ARPS system ends in Howell and restarts in Grand Rapids. Dennis estimated that the cost to utilize used equipment, antennas, and hard-line would be approximately \$500 to \$600. To simplify the installation, the digipeater would originally be set to only the state emergency frequency. If the Association was to use new equipment instead, the cost would rise to \$3,000. Because the new repeaters would also benefit the ARPS organizations in Grand Rapids and Detroit, it was suggested that we request that they help defray the cost of putting up the repeaters. It was also suggested that we ask the cell-phone company to donate the hard-line for the project. Anyway, the organization decided that we must either use all new equipment or all used equipment as it did not make any sense to use new equipment only on one repeater. As a result of the questions and suggestions, Don/W8BQD moved that Dennis and Clint obtain a more definitive cost and placement plan. Don/WB8NUS seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Next, Scott/W8SRN reported that our HamFair 2000 was incredibly successful. Based upon the final accounting, the fair turned a \$1,541.01 profit, so we and

CMARC will receive \$770.51 each. Based upon our estimates, approximately 600 people attended the event. Even though the Summit did not advertise the event on the big electronic sign in the same manner as they had promised and gave us last minute problems, the Association determined that next year's fair should also be held at the Summit. As a result, it was decided that the committee needed to get a contract price as soon as possible. Regarding the tables and chairs, the membership determined that the committee should find another supplier as the one used this year seemed to be too expensive. Furthermore, the membership decided that the prices must be no longer than they were for HamFair 2000. To give the committee more latitude in purchasing and advertising the door prizes, those present decided that they would receive \$600 to be used as the committee saw fit to purchase prizes. To help outside amateur groups advertise their organizations without conducting any sales, we decided to set a maximum of 10 free tables and 10 free tickets to be used for this purpose provided that those that are still unreserved two weeks before the event will be returned to general sales. Last, the Association again decided that CMARC and LCDRA would need to enter into another 50/50 profit and liability agreement just like one used this year.

Last, the Association elected its officers for the next year. Dan/W8BCI will serve as acting president. Don/W8BQD will act as our vice-president. Troy/W8TCC will take over as secretary. Scott/W8SRN will retain the treasurer duties. Hal/WA8LAY and Bruce/KC8ODP will serve as our directors. After the election, Jim/KA8DDQ moved that we adjourn with Doug/N8OBZ seconding the motion. Of course, the motion passed unanimously.

Eventually Tom stopped asking altogether. But he did remember, and a few years later he told his younger brother, Dave, about the all-leather, NFL regulation, 1963 Chicago Bears-inscribed football that was special and kept somewhere in the garage. Dave came to me one day and asked if he could take that special football and throw it around for awhile. It seemed like I'd been through this before, but I patiently explained, once again, that you don't just go out and throw around an all-leather, NFL regulation, 1963 Chicago Bears-inscribed football.

I stood alone in the garage. The boys had long since moved away from home, and suddenly I realized that the football had never been so special at all.
