The following items were discussed at tonight's board meeting:

? Randy Stortz (K8VY) gave his treasurer's report. Future reports will itemize "expenses" and "income" for LCDRA items.

- There have been no reported marriages, births, deaths, or anniversaries.
- There are no known upgrades.
- If CMARC is incorporated, has it been filing income tax returns? Pam Denomme (KB8PSF) explained to the board that we don't have to if gross receipts are less than \$25,000 per year. However, we should file a non-profit corporate report with the state Corporate and Securities Committee.
- Since CMARC is losing money, the board discussed pro-rating dues. This would give former members a chance to renew at a reduced rate.
- Bruce announced that Dan Harger (W8BCI) and Tom Shaver (KC8NJK) will co-chair Ham Fair this year.

Meeting was adjourned at 7:30.

Field Day will be at Gardner Middle School this year. The former location, Camp Kiwanis, is under new ownership and wanted to raise the

rental to \$205.

3. We need to gather ham radio information for a display which will explain ham radio to outsiders.

Our website is on QSL.net, which needs money. CMARC will donate \$50. Moved by Mike Rhew (KC8DBO) and seconded by Pam Denomme (KB8PSF).

The Scope will be entered in a competition of newsletters.

We discussed the coming drill in Delta Township. Hams will be included in the drill.

Announcements

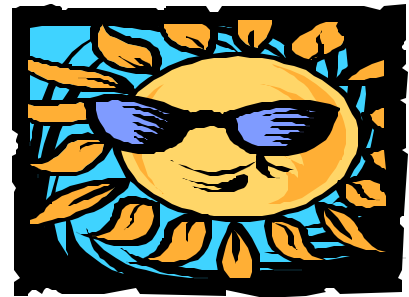
Per Don Tillitson (WB8NUS) ARRL has red vests for \$10. Don also mentioned Women on Wheels (WOW) on July 19.

From the Editor:

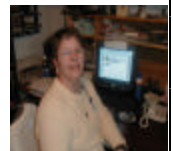

League Warns of Bogus Solicitation
(Jun 25, 2003) -- NEWINGTON, CT. Somebody out there is trying to "sell" subscriptions to *QST*, but it's not the ARRL. ARRL Customer Service/Circulation Manager Kathy Capodicasa, N1GZO, said she has received several phone calls and e-mails from members reporting the scam."

Apparently, there is some kind of bogus telephone solicitor out there trying to get people's names, addresses and credit card numbers," she said. "ARRL does not solicit for 'subscriptions' to *QST*. Under no circumstances should a member give out their credit card numbers to someone trying to sell them *QST*."

QST is the official membership journal of the ARRL and is not available to the general public from a magazine distributor or publishing house.

Should you receive a call from the phony solicitor, Capodicasa asks that you try to get the solicitor's name and check the caller ID box, if one is installed, for the caller's number. The information can be e-mailed to her at n1gzo@arrl.org, or you can reach her at 860-594-0257.

Lure Away Wasps

If wasps are making your outdoor activities miserable, lure them away with a little sugar water in a plastic food container. Cut a small hole in the lid and snap it on over the sugar water. The wasps will be drawn in and trapped inside.

How to Build Your Own Battery

As the proud owner of an Elecraft K2 and now a new Buddy Pole dipole antenna from W3FF antennas at Dayton, I decided it's time I get serious about doing some portable hammin' from a picnic table here and there.

The K2 has it's own built-in 2.9Ah gel cell battery that would work very well for limited portable use (10-12 hrs) but shortly after I purchased my Buddy Pole antenna, Budd W3FF, sent me a photo of a neat battery box that not only supplied power to whatever rig you had attached but also served as a VERY STABLE base support for the 12ft painter pole that is commonly used to support the Buddy Pole Dipole (40-2 meter dipole). Using Budds photo as a guide line, I reworked the dimensions of the battery box to fit a 105Ah deep cycle battery that I had on hand.

Budd had his built out of 1/2" plywood but having lots of 3/4" plywood left over from some projects, I decided to go Heavy Duty. You'll have to figure out which battery you have available and build the box to match. I built my box approximately 1/4" larger than the battery.

After building the box, I sanded and filled in my "Divots" with wood filler, primed the box with two coats of good primer and applied 2 coats of Apple Red paint. A friend who owns a sign shop applied my call letters and the RACES signs to the sides of the box. I then covered

the signage with Plexiglas to protect them.

The output power connections I also got from Dayton. From each pole of the battery, I have inline 40 Amp fuses going to a 50 amp Anderson Power connector. The matching 50 power pole connector has 4 sets of smaller Anderson Power pole connectors attached so you can run up to 4 separate radios or accessories from this one battery.



I enjoyed the project. It took me about 3-4 hours of work after I decided exactly what I wanted to do and how I wanted it to look. Come on out to Field Day and see the finished project.

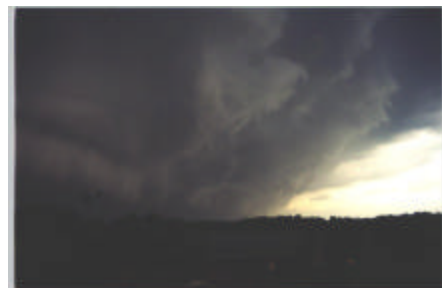
