Key of the month

This months Key of the Month is an old favorite of radio operators who served on the high seas. The U.S. Navy Flameproof Key. This key was made during and after WW2 by Bunnell in New York. The actual contacts are enclosed within a metal cover so that a spark from the contacts wouldn't ignite any flammable vapors that may be in the compartment. They have a fairly friendly "feel" and are easily adjusted for operator preference. Many a young radiomen trained on these until they increased their code speed, then moved up to a "bug". These keys are easily acquired at swaps as the military made thousands of them. They are still a good buy, and a good first key for the novice cw op.

PUBLIC SERVICE HONOR ROLL IN ACTION

Each month in *QST's* Public Service column, the Public Service Honor Roll (PSHR) recognizes the efforts of Amateur Radio operators who are active in many aspects of public service. This includes net operations, traffic handling, emergency operations and public service communication support. There are chances that you're already involved with some aspect of Amateur Radio that would apply to the Public Service Honor Roll (PSHR).

Take a look at these categories and descriptions to see where your Amateur Radio activities fit in. At the end of each calendar month, just add up your qualifying points. If it reaches the 70-point level (or more), you've qualified for the Public Service Honor Roll! Report the good news with your call sign and monthly PSHR point total to your ARRL Section Manager. The ARRL section leaders, in turn, would forward the report onto ARRL Headquarters so that Headquarters staff may prepare these for listing in the Field Organization Reports segment of *QST's* Public Service column.
