Field Day Thoughts and Memories

I first worked Field day in 1951. It was held at Boy Scout Camp east of Mason. There was a large 2 story building with sleeping quarters on the second floor with several rooms on the first floor, a large kitchen and dining area.

One year we had a bad electrical storm come up and we unhooked antennas and ceased operation. Some of us were standing in the windows looking east when lightening struck a barn and set it afire. We noticed Harmon Streeter was busy on CW with all the static and was working one after another. He looked up and wanted to know why we weren't on the air as the bands were very good. Harmon was a shipboard operator so the storm didn't bother him a bit.

One year Gordon Main was a dealer for Hallicrafters so he got us to field test the new KW desktop transceiver. This was the first of its kind. Very exocitic to tune but worked great. We assembled a tri band beam the night before and put the elements on my car top carriers with the boom. Norm Parker, who with his brothers owned a masonry business had just bought a new tractor with forks on the front so we decided to use this as a tower. It went up about 40 feet. In arriving at field day site Ben Hassel was in charge of CW and wanted to know what the phone people were thinking as they had antennas all up and ready to go. Ben was upset as he didn't think we were ready. The step van of the Lushwells pulled in and parked on the hill west of the building and Norm came up with the tractor and we had the beam together and mounted to the rotator on one of the forks in a few minutes. We had a 80 and 40 dipole fastened by the rotator so up the boom went and hooked the coax on rig and we were on the air in about a half hour.

Sunday morning I was on 20 meters and we had about 8-10 stations calling us each time we stood by. What a joy it was! Everyone wanted to work us. Got a call from an English station who wanted to know what we

were using and what kind of an antenna we had that cost \$12,000. A field day I will never forget.

On Sunday when we had the stations down and loaded our families had come out and we had a big family picnic. We had a watermelon spitting seed contest after dinner.

An interesting experience was to keep log for Ricky Hayner as Ricky was of an exclusive group that copied CW at about 80 wpm. He would slowly keep increasing his speed and then complain no one would answer. You then had to slow him down to 20wpm and watch the speed start creeping up again.

These are a few thoughts of field days that I have from the past.

Field Day 2006 - a CW point of view.

This years FD effort was great fun. We did several things differently this year. But still did not out run Murphy. Friday evening found Tim Marshall, Phil Perrault and I out stringing wire up in the trees. Had to go to the store and buy more sinkers, because I kept losing them to the hungry branches. We finally packed it up for the night right at dusk.

This year we tried QRP. We used an Elecraft K2 running on battery power at about 8 to 9 watts output. I'd always wanted to try low power operation at Field Day because I can usually get antennas up higher than at my home QTH. This year we put up 4 antennas. A dipole on 20M at 35 feet, a dipole on 40 at 60 feet, a half square on 40 at 60 feet, and a 1000 foot horizen. Loop at 30 – 60 foot level. I figured running QRP I may want a bit more UMPH on 80 meters. We fed the loop right into the tent with improvised "Fred Flintstone" style parallel line. How did the 8 or 9 watts and the loop play? Well at dawn on Sunday morning I worked every station I heard on the 1st call. Never had to call twice. I was quite pleased with the loop. (Although when putting it up I did have visions of it creating an artificial AURORA over the entire state! It did not quite play that well!)


At about 8AM I switched back to 40 and gave a listen on the loop. It was maybe 1 S unit up from the dipole. I definitely want to experiment with big loops at future Field Days. Scott Rowe put up a half square for 40 and although it did not seem to play any better than the dipole, it did net me 1 QSO that I couldn't catch with the dipole. Perhaps a Bruce array or Sterba Curtin to experiment with next year. That's half the fun on FD, to try to use antennas that you can not use at home due to size. It's neat to see what works and what doesn't.

We ended up with 280+ QSO's in the log. A very good score indeed. Thanks to all the operators and loggers who came out to help, Don Devendorf, Tim Marshall, Jordon Mulder, Phil Perrault, Rick Klingensmith, Scott Rowe, and others. A special thanks also too Roger and DeAnna Barnhill for providing some great FD style chow! July's pick for "Key of the Month" is the Vibroplex Lightning Bug. This "Lightning Bug" is a Deluxe model from 1930, Ser.# 104554. It has a glossy black base with gold pin stripes. After sending some code to get accustomed to the feel, I realized that sending speed had to be 30+ WPM to have it sound like well spaced characters. So you had to be sending "fast as lightning" to have it sound good. Hence the monicker. The bug has a very positive SWING and is well behaved. It has enough weight that it doesn't wander around the desk. One of Vibroplex's finer instruments, this one still attests to that, over 75 years after it was made! Made me wonder just how many operators made their living with this bug. This one came into my possession from a SK estate in 2003.
