Here is a follow up on the action items previously sent, and some things still to discuss at our next meeting on April 13th.

- 1 Location has been confirmed at Gardner Middle School.
- 2. Jim Harvey agreed to run a VHF effort again this year.
- Roger stated that tables and chairs would be available to borrow from his church. Roger: Please let
 me know if you need assistance in transporting them, I can make my small utility trailer available if
 needed.
- 4. Still waiting to hear back from John Hosford as to the status of servicing the club generator. He was going to tap Jim Harvey for that task.
- 5. Field Day signs: I believe they are with John Hosford. I was wondering if we wanted to make (or have made) larger ones, maybe in banner form to be slung between a couple poles or trees etc.
- 6. Public Information Officer: I'd like to have a volunteer to take pictures (Bob?). Clint Hannahs will be assisting with setting up an information table.
- 7. Press Release: If there are no volunteers I can take that one on. I'd like to see it out to the media a couple weeks prior to the event, and thena follow up a day or so before.
- 8. 2-Meter talk in. Need a couple folks to have their HT's with them and keep an ear tuned to 145.39 Roger said he'd help on this. I would like at least one other.
- 9. Get prices of tent enclosures. Need someone to do the legwork on seeing what's out there and how much. Roger brings up a good point about storing them. There is very limited space in the radio room. If the price is right and we find a place to store them we can bring this to a vote.
- 10. I've decided to stay with the logging software we used last year WR9R, it is tailored to Field Day and runs on about anything. Gregg: How's your laptop doing? I rebuilt mine and it's ready, I'll check with Jim to see if I can talk him into computer logging this year. Wish me luck on that! :) As far as a logging server, unless we had multiple stations on the same mode, there isn't a need for it. So far no one has come forward with the offer to run additional stations. Will keep asking though!

11. I have created a quick and dirty operator signup sheet (see attached) which I will to bring to the next three meetings, one for each station. My idea is to get at least a couple signed up but also have "free" periods when any drop in operators could sit down and try their hand.

Grayline DX Observations

Over the past year I have been rising early (about 5am) and coming to the M.S.U. shack, W8SH to listen up for grayline band openings. This is done right before and after sunrise and sunset. I had read about grayline DX propagation in many of the magazines but until I got a job here at MSU, I never bothered to get up early enough to see what it was all about. After listening in 2 or 3 days a week for a year now, I have begun to get a feel for what happens on the grayline. Being as we are in the bottom of the sunspot cycle I was a bit apprehensive about getting up so early and wasting potential good sleep time, but I have been rewarded with some very nice DX contacts over the year.

<u>First observation is:</u> The bands are not always open. Many mornings I came in to absolutely terrible conditions on the bands, but almost always heard some US stations to QSO with on 40 and 80 meters, and as a result I have made some new morning friends.

<u>Second observation</u>: Even when there are good grayline openings they only last about half an hour, not much more. If you wake up and see the sun, you missed it. Although the openings are short, they seem to cover a very wide geographical area on some mornings, yet, on others very specific geographic regions, as if a "pipeline" exists briefly.

<u>Third observation</u>: On certain mornings, I could hear the DX stations but they couldn't hear me. Even when running higher power. (100 watts) So there may have been other things going on with the ionosphere on those days. Possible sporadic "E" or Aurora effects.

<u>Fourth observation:</u> When the band opening is good, high power is not necessary. I've worked many good DX contacts with just 5 watts. Examples of some of the DX worked in the last few months include, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Antarctica, Aruba, Nicaragua, Columbia, Peru, Galapagos Is, Norfolk Is., and others. Lot's of good catches out there for the patient DXer.

<u>Fifth observation:</u> Many DXers are creatures of habit. If you hear a DX station on Wednesday, and can't quite work them, try listening in the next Wednesday to see if they show up. I've heard several of the same stations on a particular day of the week. So there you have it. The hardest part about working the "Grayline" is getting up in the wee hours of the morning. But for those brave early risers, there are big DX dividends. Hope you have fun surfing the radio waves.
