What's My Sign?

I was born at Sparrow Hospital in Lansing, Michigan in June of 1961, to a family rich with love for Radio. My Paternal Grandfather, Cedric, was a Methodist Minister at Port Austin (in the Thumb), where he was the Pastor to three Churches at the same time. He also took a course in Radio Repair and did that on the side. Later, when he moved the family to Flint, he built the first Methodist owned-and-operated AM broadcast radio station (WMRP) for their Church in 1946. Even though my Grandfather never got his Ham license, he did pass along his love for Radio. That's how my Dad acquired his love for Radio/Repair and in 1947, when he was 17 years old, he got his Ham ticket. In the early 1960's, my Maternal Grandfather, Harry Taylor, WA8TCD (SK) got his Novice license with 5 wpm Morse Code, and a year later he upgraded to Technician. He tried extremely hard to increase his Code to 13 wpm, but was never quite able to overcome his nerves when it came time to take that test.

As you can see, all of my life I've been around Radio and to this day, I can still remember what our basement looked like back when I was a little kid, and WHAT a vivid memory it made! Our basement was Dad's workshop. It had a huge monster of a workbench (at least to me), which was very sturdy and always completely covered with radio parts and equipment in various stages of repair or construction. There was also Dad's Ziegenbein Award (which he won in 1965), proudly displayed amongst other Ham paraphernalia, as well as various golf items and a very interesting weather station he had built.

My interest in Amateur Radio began when my parents purchased a crystal radio kit for me, which Dad helped to assemble. I was fascinated to hear distant radio stations with nothing more than the few parts I had just hastily put together! As I grew older, my interest grew as well, and the kits kept coming—mostly at Christmas time. A Heathkit HW-70 was my first rig and I'm pretty sure I built it while studying for the exam and learning the Code from Dad. I received my Novice Class license in 1974, when I was 13 years old, and now I'm a General. I really enjoy HF and my station consists of a Kenwood TS-570 DG fed into a ground-mounted Hy-Gain trap vertical. HF CW ragchewing is my favorite pastime and I have a keen interest in contesting—mostly Field Day, but more recently ARRL Sweepstakes. I really enjoy Field Day and look forward to it every year. I also love working public service events for the Lansing/Ingham ARPSC, to which I belong. In addition, I'm an active member of CMARC where I've served as a member on the Board of Directors.

I met my wife, Maribeth, while out at a local pub. MY friends were friends with HER friends and the rest is history. We have two daughters—Katie is in the 5th grade and Carie is in the 4th. So far, I'm the only one licensed in our family, but both daughters have participated in ARRL Kids Day. I'm employed at the Broad Stripe Cable Company where I work as a Data Network and RF Engineer repairing fiber optics. I also love computer problem-solving, and Auto Mechanics has been like a second hobby over the years, mostly as a method of keeping our "fleet" running!

Well, now that we've gotten a little better acquainted, "What's My Sign?" My Callsign is WD8BCS and my name is Ron Harger. Now that you know who I am, you know that my Dad is Dan Harger, W8BCI and my (step) Mom is Marlene, KC8GXO, who got her Technician license in 1997. "73" to all!

National Ham News

DEATH CANCELS PIRATE STATION FINE

The FCC has canceled a \$10,000 fine against the late Henry Gaye for operating an unlicensed radio transmitter. This, because Gaye has passed on.

The text from the FCC was short and to the point. Dennis Carlton, regional director of the South Central Region of the Enforcement Bureau, wrote: "The Tampa Office has since learned that Mr. Gaye passed away. Because Mr. Gaye is no longer living, we cancel the NAL."

U.K. RAID NETS 20 PIRATES OFF THE AIR

Ofcom, the United Kingdom's telecommunications regulator has announced that it recently carried out enforcement action against over 20 illegal broadcasters in various parts of London. The operation was carried out between February 6th and 16th in cooperation with the Boroughs of Hackney, Haringey, Tower Hamlets and Islington, and the Metropolitan Police.

This enforcement action resulted in three arrests, one studio raid, and the removal of 22 transmitters from the airwaves. Ofcom estimates that there are still over 150 illegal stations operating in the UK,

with half of those broadcasting across London and the South East.

HAMS TRAIN FOR SKYWARN IN TERRE HAUTE INDIANA

Amateur radio operators and others in Terre Haute, Indiana took time out on Monday night, February 25th to learn how to identify dangerous storms. This, at a class where trainee storm spotters got a lesson in spotting potentially severe weather formations.

Dave Tucek, KC9CNF, is a meteorologist with the National Weather Service in Indianapolis. He spoke to more than 60 amateur radio operators and other weather spotters gathered for the 2008 Weather Spotter Class sponsored by Illiana Indiana Skywarn. He says that storm spotters are vital in identifying dangerous storms at the ground level.

He said that weather radar often only tells the National Weather Service what is happening several thousand feet above the ground but not what's going on down here at ground level. Weather spotters, such as those in Illiana Skywarn, are vital for issuing correct severe weather warnings, watches and advisories, Tucek said.

Wisconsin Hams Assist Injured Driver

On Wednesday, February 27, Brian Sprecher, KC9LCC, of Prairie Du Sac, Wisconsin, received a radio call on the 147.150 Madison repeater requesting emergency help. Robert Stout, WB9ECK, of Monticello, Wisconsin, told Sprecher that a vehicle had gone off the road through a guard rail, stopping short of a creek.

The driver was injured and trapped in his vehicle and an ambulance was needed at the scene. Sprecher called the Dane County sheriff's office to relay the information. Stout, via the repeater, kept Sprecher apprised of the driver's injuries; Sprecher, in turn, updated the sheriff's dispatch with the information.

Stout remained at the scene providing aid until local police arrived. Sprecher relayed all information to the dispatcher until local authorities arrived and assumed control. "It sounds like the guy drove off the road through a guard rail and may have not been found had it not been for WB9ECK.

It was also unknown how long the driver had been over the embankment before being found. This could have been a lot worse had WB9ECK not become involved," Sprecher said.

500 kHz Distance Record Broken Again

On February 21, Neil Schwanitz, V73NS/WD8CRT, on Roi-Namur in the Marshall Islands, received a signal from experimental station WD2XSH/6. This experimental station, operated by Pat Hamel, W5THT, is located in Long Beach, Mississippi -- 6679 miles away from the island in the Kwajalein atoll. This contact breaks the previous record for the longest 500 kHz contact. That record, set in January 2008, was for a distance of 4737 miles from Cottage Grove, Oregon to Roi-Namur. An article on Hamel's station appears in the March issue of QST.

The ARRL 500 kHz experimental license, WD2XSH, was issued in September 2006 and has 20 active stations. Fritz Raab, W1FR, of Vermont, serves as experimental project manager for The 500 KC Experimental Group for Amateur Radio. ARPSC MEETING

February 18, 2008

CALL TO ORDER:

- 1. Meeting called to order at 19:03 hrs by Tom Shaver (KC8NJK)
- 2. 25 in attendance with introductions by each person.
- 3. Christine Hendrickson, ICSD and Trent Atkins & Mike Tobin, City of Lansing EMD attending.
- 4. Meeting Agenda, Monthly FSD-212, and Attendance sheet passed around to all

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Several members still do not have a valid City of Lansing ID card. Trent Atkins, (KD8HQB) Lansing EMD will bring the camera to the next meeting at Station 8. A valid background check is required and the form is available on the LARPSC web site. 2. All folders with the FEMA certificates were brought to the meeting tonight for verification of required classes. The log sheet with member's certification was passed around for review. If you have taken a class but no longer have your transcripts, you may request them at: http://training.fema. gov/EMIWeb/downloads/tranrqst1.pdf. The transcripts are mandatory to retain your RACES card. If you have not completed the required classes, contact Tom Shaver by phone or e-mail to update him on your plans to complete the on-line classes. IS-2 may be substituted for IS-22. The classes are not optional! Please don't jeopardize your RACES card by missing these classes. 3. Several LARPSC logo designs were passed around for review. Several received multiple "stars" as our members evaluated the logos.
- 4. The weekly LARPSC net is going well. Typically 9-16 persons check into each net and several persons have assumed Net Control duties. As the net matures, the length will be shortened.
- 5. Ingham Co. Sheriff Dept. is installing the door locks and PROX readers for access to the Mason ICSD EOC. Mike Perez's (N8OUN) office will contact the selected LARPSC members for PROX card photos when the equipment is installed.
- 6. Dennis (KB8ZQZ) sent an e-mail to Jeff Kludy, City of Lansing Radio Lab requesting a time to meet and discuss possible locations for the new D-Star repeater. Sev-

- eral pieces of equipment have arrived and were sent to Livingston Co. for configuration.
- 7. No update to the EAS policies at the recent meeting.
- 8. Dennis (KB8ZQZ) and Dave (K8QH) will continue to work on the MEPIN station installation. Once basic installation is complete, limited-paging functions could begin using the 2-meter input. Dennis is still planning on a donated Delta radio (from John Imeson, N8JI) for use as a UHF link radio.
- 9. We are unable to purchase new furniture under the grant funding. Some limited funds are available to still keep the project moving. Tom (KC8NJK), Ben (WX8BEN), Bob (K8RDN) and Curt (KC8QYV) volunteered to start the remodel project.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1. 77 have registered for the March 29th Skywarn training at the LCC west campus. 20 of the 77 are not licensed amateur radio operators. Bill (WD8NYW), Curt (KC8QYV), Dave (K8QH), Tom (KC8NJK), Jim (KC8QWH) and Ginny (KD8HPG) have offered to help Ben (WX8BEN) with the registration and paperwork duties the day of the training. Bill (WD8NYW) will write a press release and distribute to the media outlets. Walk-ins will be accepted if space is available. Jim has the previous list of SkyWarn graduates and issued ID numbers.
- 2. Rob Dale (N8GSK), WLNS TV Meteorologist will be the speaker at the next Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club meeting on March 7th.
- 3. Ben (WX8BEN) continues to develop the LARPSC database. This database will be available to Lansing/Ingham ARPSC leadership, as well as City & County Emergency Management to aid in responding to service requests. As an example, the database will contain information commonly found in QRZ, VanityHQ, and FCC licenses. It will also include FEMA certifications, equipment resources, SkyWarn number, etc. Dennis (KB8ZQZ) will be an alternate database administrator during the development stage.
- 4. Several pieces of new ATV equipment have arrived. 2 existing kits will receive upgraded cameras and cases. 1 new 902

- MHz kit will be assembled. Several pieces of equipment must still be purchased. Mike Hamel, Lansing EMD has been very patient and helpful with the purchase process for the equipment. Work will begin on the video kits later this spring pending work on the MEPIN project.
- 5. Several ideas for a LARPSC display at the CMARC Field Day site were discussed. ATV was a popular idea along with other digital modes. We are still looking for someone to head up the project. This is an excellent opportunity to show some of our abilities to our fellow amateurs, general public and visiting dignitaries without competing or drawing away from the CMARC Field Day activities. Trent (KD8HQB), Lansing EMD, offered to provide portable restrooms for the Field Day site.

- March 26th at 6:00pm. The meeting will be held at Fire Station #8.
- 7. Dave (KC8ZGZ) made a presentation on the Michigan Volunteer Defense Force More information is available at the web site www.mivdf.org or by contacting Dave.
