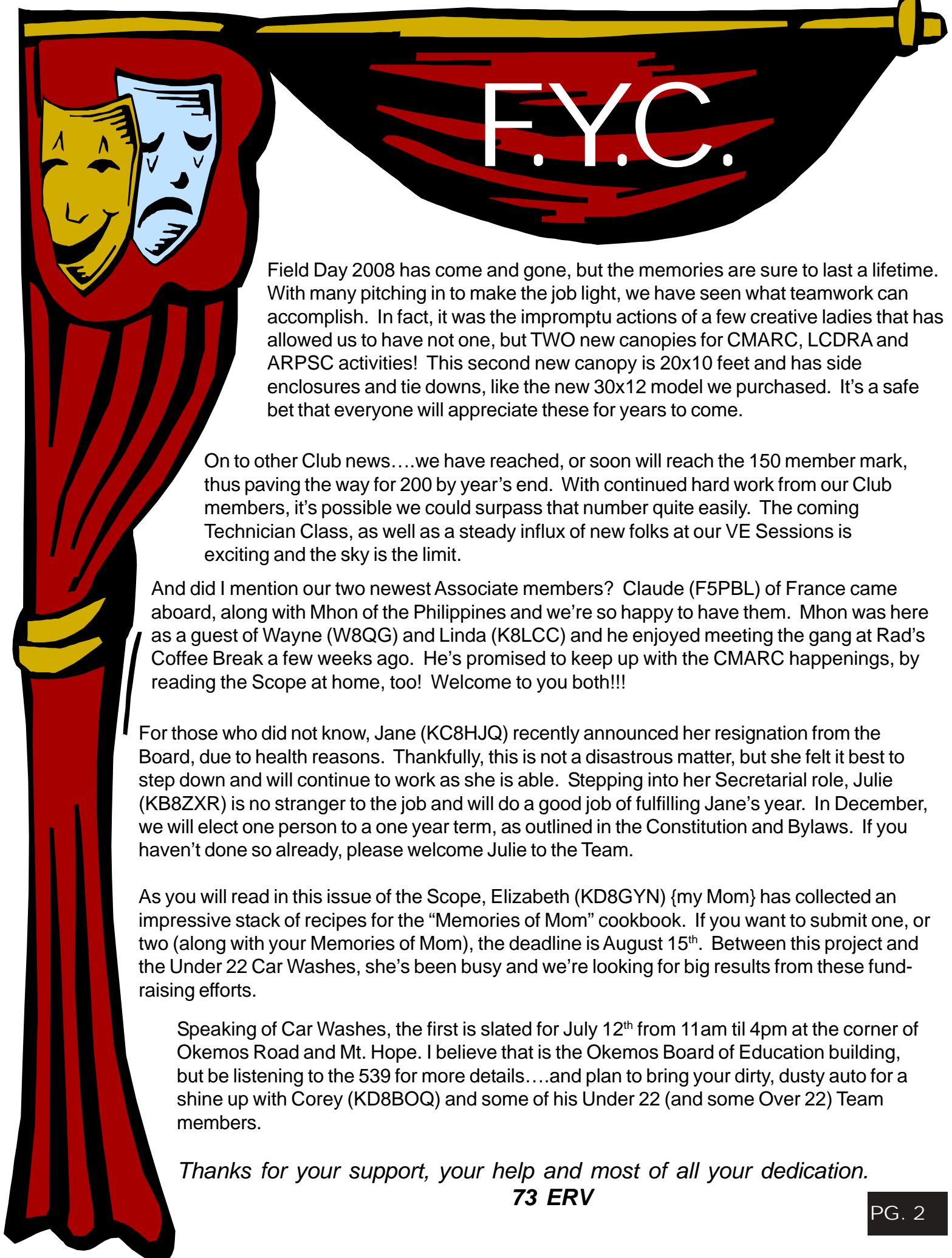

I was born on May 14, 1973 at Sparrow Hospital in Lansing. My family lived in Holt and that is where I grew up, went to school and even worked for many years. I played hockey for 13 years and baseball for almost that long, but eventually gave it up so I could play hockey year around. I was really into roller skating and went at least once a week until I was 18. I was very much into bicycles, too, until I got a moped license and eventually a driver's license. After I graduated from High School I went to college at L.C.C.

I became interested in Amateur Radio in October of 2007 when a friend of mine started talking about wanting to get his license. On October 18th, only five days after talking to Don, I got my Technician license.

As a fairly new Ham, I don't really have a favorite band or mode yet—it's still so early in the game for me. I have been having fun with my 2m/440 privileges and like working simplex as well. One of my favorite things to do is to work stations during times of band enhancement. I've hit repeaters more than 200 miles away on an HT during some exceptional openings, as well as stations over 100 miles away on 2m simplex. I also enjoy the IRLP and have dabbled a bit in Slow Scan TV. As of right now, I still only have the equipment I started with—a Yaesu FT-5100 mobile/base, a Yaesu FT-60 HT and my antenna which is the ever-popular 2m copper cactus j-pole, which works quite well. I have plans to upgrade to a 2m/70cm antenna before the end of summer, but I'm not sure which one it will be as of yet. Even though I haven't been able to participate in very many Ham-related activities so far, I do belong to CMARC and attend as many meetings as possible.

Although my wife and I went to the same High School together, we never met until after we graduated. Micki and I dated for 6 years, have been married for 8 and our little baby girl Rachel Rae is now fifteen months old already! I spent a little over ten years in the pizza business learning the ins and outs, with the intention of someday owning one myself. However, somewhere along the way, I decided that's not what I wanted to do for the rest of my life. Now I'm in my tenth season at a lawn care/snow removal business which I own and operate. Besides the Amateur Radio Hobby, I also love spending time camping, riding ATV's and driving RC cars and trucks.

I'm glad I finally got my Technician License and think I would have gotten involved years ago if CB hadn't become so unpleasant that it just turned me off to anything to do with Radio. I never could have imagined how nice the local Ham Radio group would be and how welcoming they were to a new Ham. Everyone has been so kind, patient and willing to help—what a nice change from my old CB days! I'm looking forward to many years in this new lifetime Hobby and "paying forward" some of the kindness I've received.

CMARC BOARD MEETING • June 5, 2008

President Erv W8ERV brought the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. Board members in attendance were: Bob K8RDN; Jane KC8HJQ; Gregg WB8LZG and Corey KD8BOQ. Excused were DeAnna KD8BDI and Ron WD8BCS (who was running the SKYWARN Net). Sitting in on the meeting were Don KB8RAD and Julie KB8ZXR.

NEW BUSINESS: Erv stated he had received an email from Jane KC8HJQ tendering her resignation as Club Secretary effective immediately (due to health reasons) and that Julie KB8ZXR had volunteered to fill in for the remainder of Jane's year. A motion to accept Julie McLain KB8ZXR as the interim Secretary for the remainder of the year was made by Jane KC8HJQ seconded by Corey KD8BOQ and approved. [Note: If Julie decides she'd like to stay on for the second year of Jane's term, she'll have to run in the election and be voted on to the Board in December.]

Don KB8RAD told the Board that he had been asked by several people if we could have a Handicapper-accessible Porta-Potty for Field Day, so he contacted Trent Atkins KD8HQB (City of Lansing Emergency Manager) to see if it would be feasible to have one of the two we normally acquire upgraded to Handicapper. Trent said that a Handicapper would cost double the usual \$85 price and that, although the City's funding was low, if CMARC could pay the difference in price, Trent would pick up the rest. After a short discussion, Julie KB8ZXR made a motion that CMARC pay the \$85 which was seconded by Corey KD8BOQ and approved.

Erv challenged the Board to contact our friends and family (both locally and in other states) and encourage them to join CMARC as Associate Members so we can grow the Club. We could have a special section on our Club website spotlighting our progress, and send updates to the ARRL to have published in the QST and elsewhere. As a result of the increased publicity, we'll no doubt bring in more members from our area. He mentioned that we already have two Associate Members from out of the area—one from the Philippines and one from France! He said we are the #3 Club in membership in the state so why can't we be #1. A few months ago, Erv talked with Dale Williams WA8EFK (the ARRL Great Lakes Division Section Manager for Michigan) and he expressed his excitement over what's happening in our Club.

We discussed other speakers to fill the slots for at least three remaining meetings for the year and the Board agreed to get Dale Williams WA8EFK for one of those. Don KB8RAD suggested that we also get John Imeson K8JI (Director of Public Safety at LCC) to come and talk about repeaters as he did at the last LCDRA meeting as it was a fantastic presentation! Bob K8RDN suggested inviting Don Devendorf to also speak.

OLD BUSINESS: Purchasing Liability Insurance for the Club was revisited from an earlier meeting and it was requested that we come to a decision so it could be purchased before the upcoming Field Day events. It would cost only \$451 a year, which is just a little over a \$1 a day and would cover such things as fire damage, medical expenses, incidences of slander and liable, etc. Don KB8RAD added to the discussion by saying that in this day and age of law suits being filed over every little thing, such insurance was indispensable. A motion to purchase the Liability Insurance was made by Julie KB8ZXR, seconded by Corey KD8BOQ and approved.

We discussed purchasing a commercial grade canopy—30 ft. X 12 ft. X 9.8 ft. with a 2" frame and 12 legs (6 per side). The total cost of the canopy and enclosure kit with four sides (3 solid and one zippered), heavy duty anchors and ropes would be \$710, including shipping. It was mentioned that if we rented a tent only two times, that cost would pay for purchasing our own. Ron Harger WD8BCS had offered to store it at his home and it will be shipped there, coming in 3 packages and weighing 270 pounds. Erv said we will be accepting individual donations and Dan Harger W8BCI has said that LCDRA will cover half of whatever is left. Erv suggested we make one stipulation for its use which was that it will be used ONLY for Club-related events and not to be loaned out for any one member for their personal use. A tent such as this would provide many occasions for use such as Field Day, Club Picnics, Swap and Shops, Special Service Events, Search and Rescue, ARPSC/Emergency situations, etc. Bob K8RDN made a motion that we bring this to the membership which was seconded by Gregg WB8LZG and approved.

Fund raising and purchasing a radio to be used as a door prize was discussed. It was suggested that we could purchase a \$200 Dual Band HT, but that we'd have to sell at least 40 tickets at \$5 each just to break even. Gregg said we could do this at the Christmas meeting when we would have more people in attendance. We will talk about this more in the July meeting after Field Day is over.

A motion to adjourn was made by Bob K8RDN, seconded by Julie KB8ZXR and approved.
The meeting adjourned at 7:38 p.m.

CMARC MEETING • June 5, 2008

President Erv W8ERV called the meeting to order at 7:45 p.m. A moment of silence was taken to recognize our Silent Keys.

ATTENDANCE: There were 28 members and 8 visitors in attendance. Our guests were Shirley Birdsley N7UPY and Dave Birdsley KF8WS from B&B Embroidery; Ginny Hannahs KD8HPG; Jim Hannahs KC8QWH; Guy Swann KC8SLJ; Tammy Garner and Ana-Mai; and Brian Adams (who will be testing tomorrow for his Technician License).

NEW LICENSES, UPGRADES and VANITY CALLS: There were none to report.

CARDS AND FLOWERS REPORT: Marie KC8NOI said there were none at this time.

OLD BUSINESS: A motion was made by Don KB8RAD to accept the May Secretary's Report as printed in the SCOPE, seconded by Jim KC8QWH and approved. A motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Jerry KD8GLN, seconded by Bill WD8NYW and approved.

NEW BUSINESS: Erv told the group about the new Liability Insurance for the Club that was approved by the Board in tonight's Board Meeting. It was mentioned that in today's litigious society such insurance is an absolute necessity and up till now we have been extremely lucky getting by without it. Ron WD8BCS will take care of obtaining the policy from the ARRL. [For more details see Board Meeting minutes above.] A question was raised as to whether we had the funding for this insurance and Erv said that our membership was steadily growing and should help provide the needed money. He reported that as of tonight, the current CMARC membership stands at 150. This is up 52 from last year, with over 30 of these being first time CMARC members!

The President announced that our CMARC Secretary, Jane KC8HJQ, had regrettably tendered her resignation at tonight's Board Meeting due to health problems. As a result, the Board appointed someone to finish out the remainder of the year. Erv introduced Julie KB8ZXR, who has graciously volunteered to serve as Secretary in Jane's place.

Erv also welcomed Dave KF8WS and Shirley N7UPY Birdsley, the owners of B&B Embroidery, who had so graciously come to tonight's meeting because many of us wanted to place orders for Callsign Shirts, Hats and Jackets, along with Emergency vests, etc. It's always nice to have them at our Club meetings and we really want to thank them for hauling and displaying all their clothing samples for us to see. Remember, if you missed the meeting and would like to order something, you can email them at <dbirdsley@tds.net>. Dave and Shirley always do a great job and have sizes for Large & Tall up to 6X.

The President talked to the group about purchasing a commercial-grade 30 ft. X 12 ft. X 9.8 ft. tent for the Club. [For complete Tent details see Board Meeting Minutes above.] After a brief discussion, Jim Hannahs KC8QWH made a motion to purchase the Tent, seconded by Don McLain KB8RAD and approved.

BREAK: We took a 15 minute break where we got to enjoy a variety of sweets including Killer Brownies, Mini Chocolate Chip Muffins, Powdered Sugar Donuts, and for those a little more health conscience we had Apples, Bananas, Homemade Sugar Free Chocolate Chip Cookies and Sugar Free Jello. For beverages we always have Regular and Decaf coffee along with regular and sugar free punch. A big "Thank You" to all those who brought the delicious treats!

After our break, President Erv announced that during the break the members had donated a total of \$310 towards the purchase of the Club Tent – which means that with LCDRA and CMARC sharing the remainder of the price they will each pay \$150 and the Tent will be completely paid for.

50/50 DRAWING: Tom Shaver KC8NJK was the winner of the 50/50 drawing and won \$15, which he promptly donated to purchasing the Club Tent. Thanks Tom for such a nice gesture!

UNDER 22 DIRECTOR'S REPORT: Corey KD8BOQ reported that the Youth have two Car Washes coming up – one on Saturday, July 12th and another one on Saturday, August 9th, in Okemos. Any money raised or donated will be used for a Balloon Launch, either this summer or next, depending on how much they make. 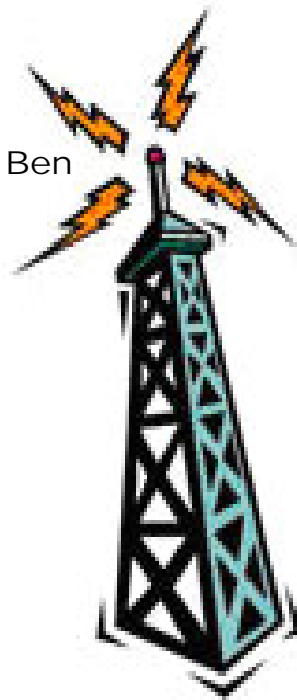

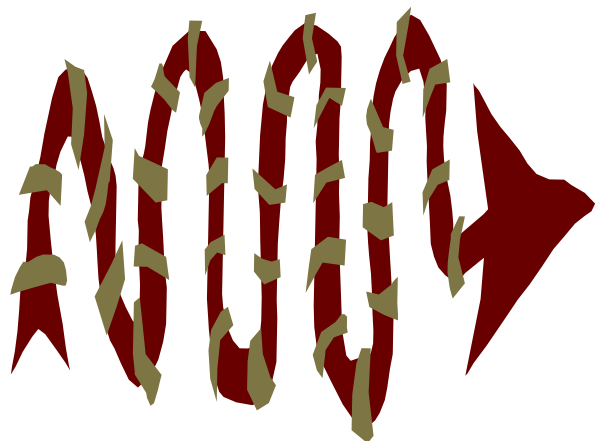
