It was a great thing to see so many come out and celebrate an event of this magnitude, but the one thing that caught my attention was the diversity of those in attendance. Young and old, neighbor, family and friend (her doctor even called to wish her a happy birthday on Sunday afternoon!)

# What's My Sign?

I was born in Indianapolis, Indiana where my family and I lived for a while before eventually moving on. As I grew up, I lived at times in Shawnee Mission, KS, Palatine, IL, Cherry Hill, NJ and Fort Wayne, IN. I graduated from High School in New Haven, IN and went on to attend Purdue University in Fort Wayne. One summer, our church in Illinois sent 4 students (including my older brother) to a missionary base in Peru for a Summer Missions Program. Each week a church member (W9CJS) would make contact with his friend (OA8B) at the missionary base in Peru, using 15 meters. My parents would talk with my brother by phone-patch or we'd go to his house to talk on the radio. That's when my interest in Amateur Radio was sparked as a young 4th grader, watching them talk to my brother on the "other side of the world".

A couple of years later, W9CJS became the Sixth Grade Boy's Sunday School teacher and taught a group of us 5 wpm code and technical theory. After passing the code test, he sent our applications to the FCC and 3 weeks later our written exams finally arrived. We took the written test (complete with us drawing oscillator circuits) while sitting outside around his picnic table, and in 1966 I got my Novice license! Later, while living in Fort Wayne, I upgraded from Technician to Advanced class. Our exams were conducted at the Post Office using the old headphones, tape code machine and straight key for sending. We sat in old wooden one-arm school chairs and my hand and arm were shaking so bad while I was copying the 13 wpm code that I had to use my left hand to hold my right arm down on the desk! In spite of being nervous and having read quickly through the technical questions the night before (after realizing I hadn't even looked at them) I still passed on my first try! I am now an Extra. [Julie's note: I asked if this person was a scanner monitor before being licensed and you may find the answer interesting. The response was that scanners hadn't been invented yet, but their dad's friend did go on to invent the "Bearcat Scanner" in the 70's.]

My Ham equipment consists of a Ten Tec Orion II for my home HF station, with dipoles and a (noisy) vertical. It's a great radio and makes copying CW easy. I never cared for CW until I got my new rig with the DSP and found it actually a lot of fun when you could filter out the other stations. There's a Motorola VHF and GE UHF radio in the shack for the repeaters. I also have a portable FT-817ND QRP rig to listen to CW while sitting on the deck on a warm summer evening as I watch the golfers on the course. I currently enjoy listening to CW the most. I've built VHF and UHF repeaters, operated through the early Oscar satellites, built RTTY modems and ran the noisy old machines on HF. I also want to eventually work some PSK-31. As a service to my community, I enjoy volunteering my time and talents working for the Lansing Amateur Radio Public Service Corps. Field Day is always a highlight of the year for me and let's not forget Sweepstakes in November! I currently belong to CMARC, ARPSC and APCO (Association of Public Safety Communications Officials).

Concerning my personal life, when a good friend of mine finally realized I wasn't going to date her younger sister, she introduced me to her roommate's younger sister who had come to Fort Wayne for Nursing School. Well, we hit it off and two years later, we were married. This December, Phyllis and I will celebrate our 35th Wedding Anniversary. We have 4 sons, 2 daughter-in-laws, a granddaughter and a grandson. In 1998, I retired from the City of Fort Wayne Communications Dept. and then, because my 2 oldest sons were in college and I wanted to help pay their tuition, I immediately went to work for the Michigan State Police. I work as the Infrastructure Services Manager of the nation's largest APCO 25 Public Safety Trunking radio system, which is owned by the State of Michigan. As far as some of my other interests go, I've been playing Bass guitar since a Sophomore in high school and I've been a weekly bass player in church for over 20 yrs. I play some electric and acoustic guitar, but bass is still my main axe.

## CMARC Meeting Notes

#### **CMARC BOARD MEETING**

JUNE 5th, 2009

President Sharon Waite /KD8HHK brought the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. with the following Board members in attendance: Secretary John Hosford/KC8QZB, Treasure Ron Harger/WD8BCS, , Director Don McLain/KB8RAD and Director Erv Bates/W8ERV. Under 22 Director Corey Bulock/KD8BOQ and assistant Under 22 Director Morgan Mosher/KD8IWT Excused were Vice Presisent Bob Berger/K8RDN.

John Hosford/KC8QZB reported that cards and flowers were sent to Inez Pierson/ KY8V,Don Tillitson/WB8NUS, A card was sent to Dick Stortz and the Daniel Poorman family.

Erv Bates/W8ERV reported that about 120 membership letters have been sent out so far and that there has not been any responses yet.

Don/KB8RAD brought in a letter about a resolution supporting the michigan emergency communications preservation act. from the michigan prb-1 committee which is trying to enact this into law in our state as they have in 27 other states which seeks to take the federal premption and make it a part of all zoning laws in the state of michigan. the committee hopes that all clubs in michigan will show their support to help get this passed into law in our state. Erv/W8ERV made a motion to adopt and pass the resolution as written, seconded by Don/KB8RAD and approved.

## A RESOULTION SUPPORTING THE MICHIGAN EMERGENCY COMMUNICATIONS PRESERVATION ACT

WHEREAS, the Federal ColmmunicationsCommission issued the 1985 declaratory ruling PRB-1 which states that local zoning authorities cannot preclude amateur radio service communications, but must reasonably accommodate those facilities and enact the "minumum practicable regulation to accomplish the state or local authority's legitimate purpose." this ruling is now a federal regulation [47 C.F.R. Section 97.15(b)].

WHEREAS, even though PRB-1 is federal law, many zoning boards and municipalities are unaware of its exis-

tence, often making the process of getting antennas approved difficult, and in a number of cases, leading to lawsuits that are time-consuming and expensive for all parties.

WHEREAS, the American Amateur Radio League, Mighigan Section, has sponsored the PRB-1 Project to get PRB-1 codified into Michigan Law as the Michigan Emergency Communications Preservation Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED that the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club, with address of P.O. Box 27321, Lansing, MI 48909-7321 Hereby encourages and supports the passing of a MICHIGAN Ememgency Communications Preservation Bill into Michigan Law.

The members and officer of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club adopted this resolution at a (regularly/ special) meeting held on June 5th 2009 CERTIFICATE OF SECRETARY

the undersigned hereby certifies that he/she is the duly elected and qualified Secretary of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club, and that the foregoing is a true and correct record of resolution duly adopted by the Centrat Michigan Amateur Radio Club on June 5th 2009. IN WITNESS THEREOF, I have executed my name as Secretary on this date of June 5th 2009.

Ron/WD8BCS reported that he got the required signatures the current president, treasurer, secretary and one represenative member of the club, Dennis Beckner. and was submitted to the bank with the clubs certificate of deposit thus updating the banks records and gives us access to the certificate of deposit. Ron/WD8BCS then transfered \$800.00 from the CD to the checkbook which brings the check balance above the minumum balance required to avoid monthly fees. this has dropped the balance in the CD to 996.80 some cents. which raised the checkbook balance to \$815.00. when the CD matures, Ron/ WD8BCS would like to make a proposal to close out the CD and transfer the funds in the CD to the savings account. Ron/WD8BCS made a motion to move the money from the certificate of deposit, when it matures, to the savings account during the 10 day grace period so that no penality would be incurred, Erv/W8ERV seconded the motion, and approved.

Erv/W8ERV reported the the new club banners are here and will be shown to the membership at the general meeting on June 5th 2009. Erv also reported that there is still over 100 cookbooks. Ron reported that we are ahead \$252.95 (we have already sold enough cookbooks to pay for the them and have paid the printing company). Corey/KD8BOQ said what if we lowered the price by a couple dollars and sold them at field day. Erv/W8ERV said he was thinking about cutting the price in half to \$5.00 and move the rest of them out. Erv/W8ERV made a motion to cut the price of the remaining unsold cookbooks to \$5.00, seconded by Ron/WD8BCS and approved.

Erv/W8ERV reported that Duane Cross sent Erv a cd with some scanned qsl cards and a patch from the michigan school for the blind and wants these items donated to the club history. Corey/KD8BOQ has talked to a couple people and they generally agree that thaey would like to see more technicial programs. Corey also wanted to see what people thought about raising membership dues to \$15.00 per year. Don/KB8RAD said that the membership dues have been \$10.00 since before they joined the club.

Erv/W8ERV wanted to know what people thought about paying for lifetime memberships for a limited time(until December 31 2009) at 10.00 for every year of age that a person is younger that 65. for instance, a person is 55 years old and thus has 10 years before they can qualify for lifetime membership. if they pay \$100.00 before December 31 2009 they could become a lifetime member. Or someone that has 23 years to go before they are 65 they would pay \$230.00 for a lifetime membership. it was brought up that this would limit future income. it was also said that they can still make a donation to the club each year if they so desire.

## **CMARC Meeting Notes**

Corey/KD8BOQ made a motion to raise the membership dues to \$15.00 effective January 1 2010 and to offer, (for a limited time), lifetime memberships until December 31 2009 at \$10.00 for every year that a person is younger than 65 years of age. Erv/W8ERV seconded the motion and approved.

John/KC8QZB reported that he has started the club generator and ran it for 15 minutes while trimming weeds.... all went well.

With all business concluded, Erv/ W8ERV made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Corey/KD8BOQ and approved. The Board meeting closed at 7:30 p.m.

#### **CARDS AND FLOWERS REPORT:**

cards and flowers were sent to Inez Pierson/ KY8V,Don Tillitson/WB8NUS, A card was sent to Dick Stortz and the Daniel Poorman family.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Ken/W8AAX made an amendment to the April 2009 meeting minutes that the plaque honoring Tiny/K8DHN be given to Tiny/K8DHN's widow not that he would buy a plaque. Ken/W8AAX reports that the plaque has been found.

Jim/KC8QWH made a motion to accept the april and may meeting minutes

as printed in the scope as corrected. seconded by Don/KB8RAD and approved.

Bernie/N8PVZ made a motion to accept the treasurers report as printed in the april and may scope subject to annual audit, seconded by Don/KD8BD and approved.

Ken/W8AAX reported that since the april meeting he has been on 30 meters almost exclusively with 100 watts using a wire dipole up about 25 feet. 30 meters has been productive, not trying very hard he has worked 87 qso's. 29 of them were dx. he has worked 34 states and had 28 of them confirmed already.

Roger/AB8RX came up to the front of the room to present the Zigenbien award. he said that there were a number of worthy canidates this year and that those that did not win will win in the near future. this years winner is someone that you all know, he's always been active in the club, he seems to be involved in everything, he was a board member for several years, he is one of those individuals that is always working in the backround. the winner is Dick Mc Guire/KI8C. Congratulations Dick.

Erv/W8ERV reported that Duane Cross sent Erv a patch from the michigan school for the blind, also a cd with scans of the patch and qsl cards from some of the club members. also some certificates one of which was given to him on the 16th of september 1964 by Jim Holcomb from the city of lansing cival defence group. Corey/KD8BOQ and Morgan/KD8IWT held the new club banners. The banners are guaranteed outdoors 24 hours a day 7 days a week for 2 years. Erv/W8ERV also reported that at the board meeting tonight the board has voted to reduce the price of the remaining cookbooks to \$5.00 from this point forward. there was also a motion at tonights board meeting for two things. 1) starting January 1 2010 the board would like to see the membership dues raised to \$15.00. there has not been a raise in membership dues since before 1994. 2) the board

Julie/KB8ZXR suggested that new hams under the age of 18 would be eligeable for a free one year membership in CMARC. after a discussion this was modified to be free membership for all licensed youth under 18 years of age. Don/KD8BD made a motion for a free membership for licensed youth under the age of 18, over 18 would be \$15.00, the \$15.00 membership dues would take effect January 1 2010, lifetime membership avalable to any current member of CMARC, to qualify for lifetime membership one would need to be a member of CMARC for 10 years or satisfy that requirement by paying \$10.00 for each year that they are short of 10 year member of cmarc or to the age of 65 whichever is greater. seconded by Jim/KC8QWH and approved.

Erv/W8ERV reported membership forms are avalable in the scope as well as on the CMARC website (centralmiarc.com).


