## Don Devendorf (W8EGI) - SK



Don was always at CMARC draw when he spoke. At his last presentation in April 2009, it was nearly a full house.

The Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club is mourning Don Devendorf (W8EGI), affectionately known as the "Grand OM" of the Club. He and Jean, his wife of 67 years, were vacationing in Ft. Meyers, Florida and Don passed in his sleep on Friday, Februrary 5th at the youthful age of 95 years.

First licensed in 1931, Don's long and storied past with CMARC stretches way back into the 1940's after his civilian service to our country at the

# What's My Sign?

I was born on April 7, 1939 in Indianapolis, Indiana. In 1944, we moved to East Cleveland, Ohio so Dad could get a better job and support his growing family. It wasn't too long after I was born that my twin brothers came along. This made the Grandparents on both sides very happy, since we were the first Grandchildren. My mother was a typical 50's "stay-at-home" Mom, and Dad was a member of the Cleveland Orchestra, playing the Oboe and English Horn for 35 years. I was only five years old when Cleveland became our new home. This is where I grew up and where, in 1957, I graduated from Shaw High School. Directly upon graduation, I went to Purdue University for 4 years, graduating in 1961 with a BS in Technical Writing. In late 1961, I was caught by the Berlin Crisis, so I enlisted in the Army for 3 years. After auditioning for and making it into the West Point Band, I was stationed in the US Military Academy at West Point in New York, receiving the rank equivalent to Sergeant.

My interest in Amateur Radio began at about 15 years of age when I noticed somebody putting up a short-wave antenna across the street. They didn't have scanners back in those days, in fact, they barely had electricity! So, this antenna sparked my curiosity and I quickly became friends with my neighbor, Mark Rickman/W8HMQ. It was through his friendship and instruction that I became a Ham, getting my first license (Novice) on November 4, 1954. In October 1955, I upgraded to General under the "friendly" eyes of the infamous Dick Cotton, who came to the Cleveland Heights area every three months from the FCC office in Detroit, since the VE program wasn't created until many years later. In 1968 (while living in Texas), I upgraded to Advanced and then on to Extra. I don't know of very many Hams in my family, but I do know that an uncle of mine had his license for many years, and I'm proud to say that my son has had his for about ten years now.

I met my wife, Susan, when we were both members of the San Antonio Symphony. I played the Oboe and English Horn and she sat right behind me on stage playing her Bassoon. On May 31, 1969, we were married and made beautiful music together for 32 years. We have one son, Ken/KC8LTL, and a daughter who lives in Cleveland, Ohio with her husband and four kids. To support our family, I worked for years as a Technical Writer composing instruction manuals for Navy Defense Equipment and electronic telephone equipment.

My wife passed away on January 14, 2001 as the result of Diabetic complications. We had been talking about getting involved with another hobby, but it wasn't until after she had passed that I got started in it. And, as many of you know, I am now an avid Roller Blader at 70 years of age and spend much of my spare time visiting different rinks for exercise and fellowship. Even though I'm a lot older than most of the other Bladers, we really hit it off and they refer fondly to me as "Grandpa".

In addition to Roller Blading, other activities that consume my "spare" time include volunteering for the Lansing Red Cross for the last 6 years, and serving as a Volunteer Examiner with the Jackson VE Team for Amateur Radio license testing. I am a member of CMARC, LCDRA and the Lansing Area/Ingham County Amateur Radio Public Service Corps. I also belong to the Cascades Amateur Radio Club in my hometown of Jackson, Michigan. You can usually find me on 2 meters and I enjoy working AM, SSB and CW on my equipment which consists of a Ten Tec Jupiter Transceiver and a Vertical antenna good for 2 meters, 3/4 meters and 1.2 GHz. At one time I chased DX, but prefer public service nowadays.

When Julie asked me if I had any nice comments to share I replied, "CMARC's a great club and that's why I make the trip all the way from Jackson to attend the meetings every month, as well as to join in on other related events."

Carl/K8YHH made a report on a possible meeting location/ club radio room. the proposed location is the Salvation Army on Jolly rd just east of Washington. he showed some pictures on the screen, the station room is approximately 20 by 30 feet, a lot bigger that the room that we were in. when we asked about putting up a tower and running coax and putting a work table in the club radio room the salvation army Captain Norton said no problem. this would make the club radio room much more available than it has been in the past, we will be able to have a lock on the door so that the room can be secured.

the meeting room is approximately 35 by 65 so there is ample room for those attending. Captain Norton has asked us to remind those in attendance that this is a church and so we are asked to be mindful and respectful of our language. we are also required to clean up after ourselves because we are one of three organizations using the facility. the meeting room is a little wider than our former meeting room at the red cross. so far the cost is a donation to the electricity that we use. there is another group that was going to rent or

lease the room but they did not get the room because they did not come up with the funding.

It is important the we act quickly because is someone decides to come up with the money, we won't have it. we were told that we would be able to put in an operating bench, and a work table in the radio room. the radio room is on an outside wall. we have been asked to participate in the SATURN program. for the first time we would have a room that can be utilized by its members. we can hold antenna building classed, soldering classes, might even be fun to build some qrp rigs and troubleshoot them. we have a new opportunity to expose another organization to amateur radio and Captain Norton has already expressed interest in getting him amateur radio license. there is more than enough parking on the side and the back of the building. the parking lot is well lit and will be plowed and sidewalks will be shoveled and salted. everything is on the first floor with handicap access. After careful consideration as well as a lengthy discussion and a vote by the relocation committee it is our recommendation that CMARC move permanently to the salvation army as soon as possible.


# **CMARC Life Membership Extension Running Out**
