APRIL'S CMARC MEETING

In addition to overseeing the Lansing Police Department Radio Shop, he is also responsible for maintaining all video, audio, and alarm technology within the city's Police and Fire departments, as well as, maintaining the Civil Defense siren alerting systems. He will be discussing the FCC's Narrowbanding Mandate for all Part 90 radio services operating in the 150-174 MHz and 421-512 MHz bands, which goes into effect on January 1, 2013. He will also discuss "rebanding" in the 800 MHz band which is a process to get all of the Sprint/Nextel frequencies separated from the public safety frequencies and is currently affecting the 800 MHz State Radio System. What's My Sign?

I was born on July 18, 1965 in Saginaw, Michigan. My father worked until he retired for GM (at the Grey Iron Foundry) as a machinist and squeeze cast aluminum R&D specialist. My mother was a stay-at-home mom, and I have one brother (who recently retired from the US Army in Colorado Springs, CO). I attended the Saginaw Valley Lutheran High School and after graduating in 1983, I went on to attend Delta Community college, getting an AAS in Electronics Engineering Technology in 1986. I then enlisted in the United States Air Force for 4 ½ years working as a Seismic Analyst for AFTAC (Air Force Technical Applications Command), studying seismic events in order to determine if they were caused by natural phenomena or by clandestine nuclear explosions. For 10 months I served in Denver, Colorado and then served for 2 ½ years at two consecutive overseas assignments to Detachment 421, Alice Springs, Australia, a remote seismic station in central Australia. I finished up my last year of enlistment in Cocoa Beach, Florida in 1991. I then went on to Delta Community college where I got an AAS in Pre-engineering in 1993, and in 1995 I graduated from MSU with a B.S. in Electrical Engineering.

I met my sweetheart, Laura, through a common friend in October 1986 at Ferris State University (at the Wesley foundation), as we were preparing to go and see Petra and White Heart in concert at Grand Valley State University. It was on a humid, but otherwise perfect day on July 11th in 1992 that we got married. We have three children, Austin (15), Julia (13) and Jason (11). I currently work as the lead design engineer for a small electronics company in Okemos, where we build miniaturized shock and vibration recorders for the aerospace industry. I also manage a subsurface data center at Michigan State University for the Seismic Department. This fall I'll cease work as design engineer and begin my studies as a full-time graduate student at MSU, studying for a PhD in Geophysics. I expect this will take about four to five years to complete.

My interest in Amateur Radio all began when my grandfather (Randy Genske), who was a radio operator for the U.S. Coast Guard and Ham since at least 1939, gave me some Ham magazines. When he retired in 1972 and moved to San Diego, he gave me his entire collection of QST, Popular Electronics and Radio Electronics, and then kept the subscriptions renewed until I was 20 years old. Together, we had every issue back to 1940. Before he passed away in 1996, I promised him that I would some day get my license. So, in the fall of 2010, at an Ingham County VE Group exam session in Mason, I passed my Technician exam, upgrading to Extra about three months later.

My shack consists of multiple ICOM IC-V8000 radios, several Yaesu HT's, and a Kenwood TS-680S which is interfaced via serial link to Ham Radio Deluxe software. The Kenwood uses two antennas: a W5GI Mystery Antenna that tunes most every band via a tuner, and a converted Solarcon A99 vertical for working 10-meters. They are mounted at approximately 36 feet, and 100 watts generally gets us pretty far. My favorite band is presently 2-meters with an EchoLink connection. My base 2-meter rig uses a home made Super J-pole, which is a conventional copper J-pole with an additional half-wave stub on-top. With this setup, I've made contacts on 2-meters as far as 380 miles. My second-favorite bands are 60-meters, as well as 10-meter FM at 29.600 MHz, where I've made lots of contacts into California, Washington state, and Vancouver in British Columbia. In addition, I'm interested in satellite uplinks and downlinks, and want to do signal bounce off weather balloons on 2-meter/440 MHz. I also want to experiment with high speed data telemetry using the microwave spectrum.

When Julie asked if I had any words of wisdom to pass along, I replied, "It's easy for us to say 'I can't", such as, 'I can't move, or it hurts too much.' I would rather say 'I presently struggle with.' It offers us so much more in terms of attitude and tenacity. Tenacious people don't ever stop struggling. Tenacious people are the ones we read about who persevere and continue to succeed despite the odds. Tenacious people are movers, achievers, explorers, inventors, artists and heroes, and I want to be one of those kinds of people my whole life. I don't want to be afraid of 'What might happen'. Instead I want to find out 'What could happen!'"

There, now that we have become a little better acquainted, "What's My Sign?" My Callsign is NE8K and my name is Dan Burk. My son is Austin, KD8OUY.




