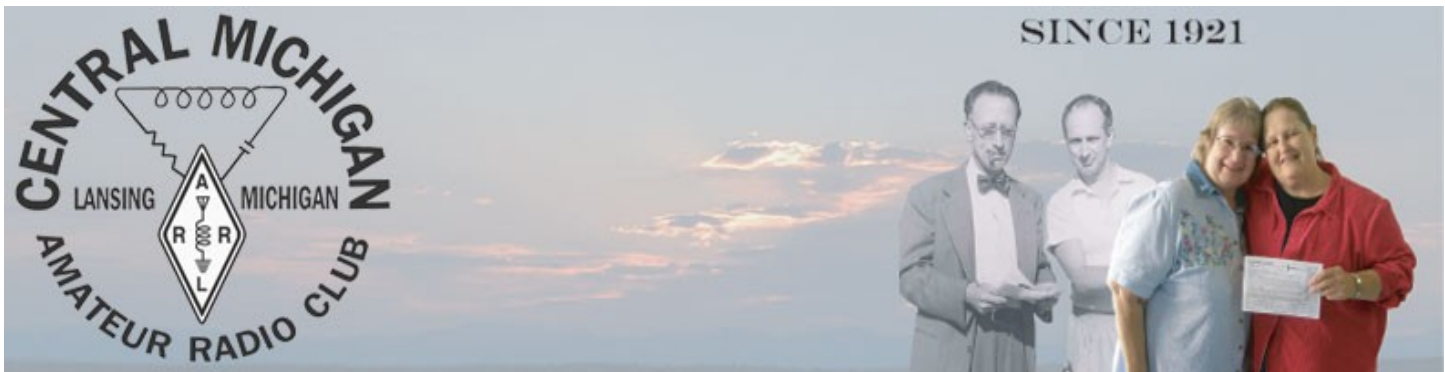

Ever wonder how to get an Amateur Radio Call-Sign License Plate?

All you need to do is to fill out an application for Original Amateur Radio Operator Call Letter License Plate, which can be found at http://www.michigan.gov/documents/orderform_aro_24944_7.pdf and send it along with a check for \$2 (\$7 if you want that UGLY graphics license plate) to the address on the form.

ARO license plates may only be issued to a person who holds a valid Amateur Radio Operator (ARO) license issued by the FCC. Under Michigan law, the only eligible ARO license types are Technician class and above. The vehicle for which the plates are issued must be titled or leased in the name of the person holding the ARO license.

The form can also be used if you already have call-sign plates, but change call-signs, like I did in May of 2011.

You will need to include a COPY of your FCC issued Amateur license with the application. Do NOT send the original, as it will NOT be returned. Photocopies are Ok.

Also, unless you're buying or leasing a car that never had plates, you won't need to figure out the automobile license registration fee. The unused portion of an existing plate is automagically applied as credit.

I received my replacement (W8BFG) plate in about a week. But then, the plate makers don't have all that much else to do for at least the next 5 to 10 years, do they? Hi! Hi!!

When you renew your automobile registration, the cost is the normal registration fee. The \$2 fee (\$7 for the UGLY Graphics plate) is a one-time only fee (unless you order a new plate with a new call-sign).

Volunteers should check in with net control when they arrive at their location. We will be dispatching CERT volunteers throughout the Marathon as well as communication for the water / First Aid stations.

Holt Festival 8-25-12 – 5K race and parade communication support requested.

EOC – Trailer is near field readiness.

Demonstration – Monday 4-23-12: Penn + Jerome – protest/demonstration 7:15-7:45am. 1 ATV camera and EOC will be in operation.

Green and White game – Following Saturday 4-28-12 – 2-3 ATV cameras have been requested.

ATV - Kits have been groomed. Caution urged when using the ATV kits to help them operate successfully. Make sure that net control knows if a kit is having issues. It is imperative to know of any problems so that the kits can be fixed quickly.

Skywarn Groups – Net Control groups are setup to make the call for Skywarn nets for severe weather events.

CodeSpear message sent from lead member when a weather net will be needed. Nets will start asking for spotters to verify that spotters checking in have been trained within the last three years. Spotters will be asked for their spotter numbers when checking into a Skywarn net.

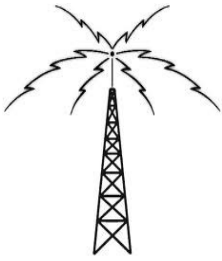
EOC Operators – Members requested for EOC stations so that there are enough people to cover a weather or service net.

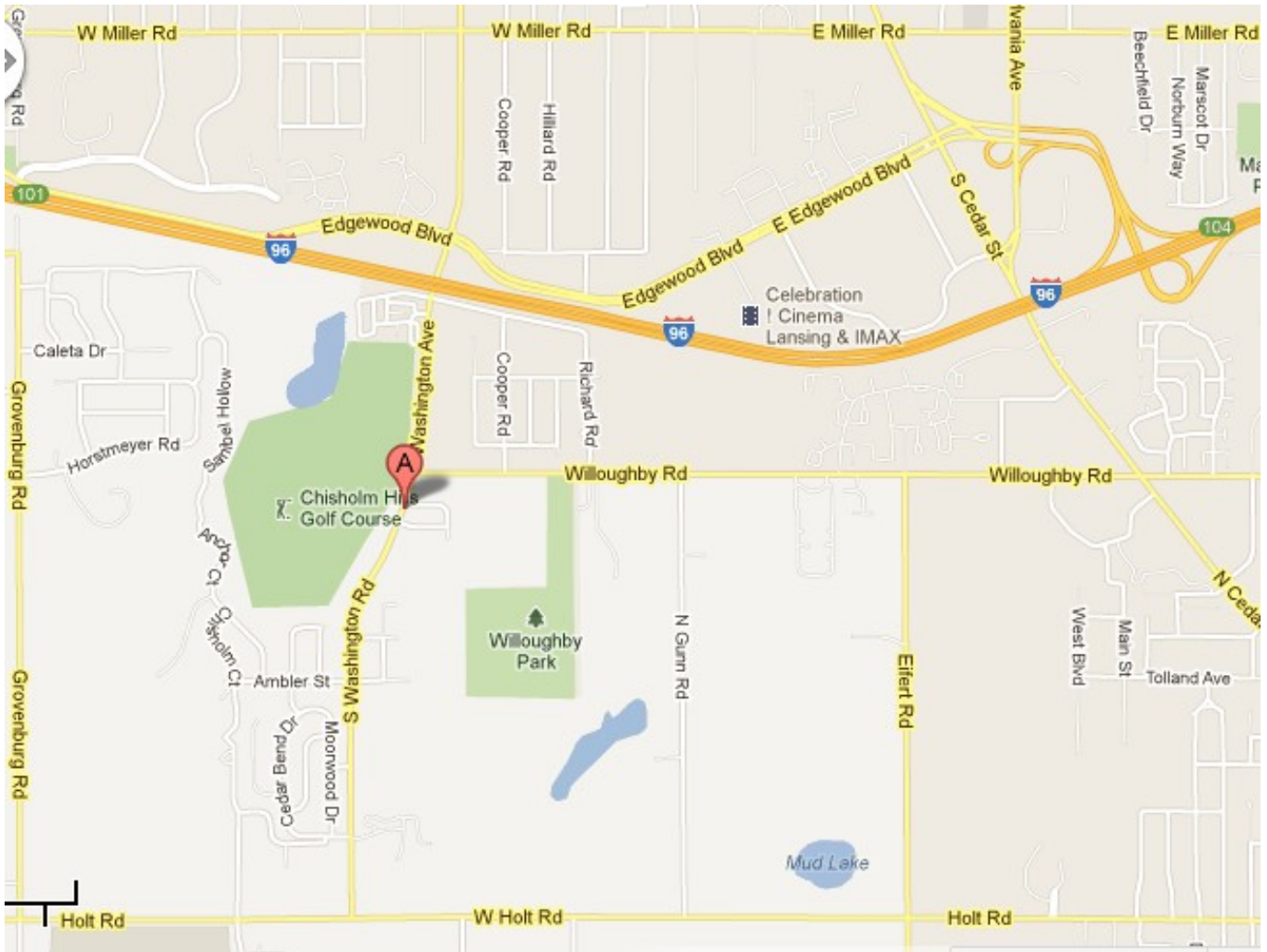

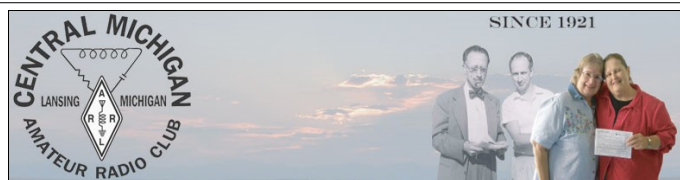
