# What's My Sign?

I was born on February 14, 1953 at Sparrow Hospital in Lansing, Michigan. I grew up on the south side of Lansing in a house my father had built when I was only 3 years old. My father worked at Schafer's Bakery where he retired after about 30 years. My mother was a stay-at-home Mom who did a wonderful job of raising me, my sister Margaret (3 years older) and my brother Gary (4 years older), considering we were all such brats! Ha! I attended Maple Grove Elementary School, West Junior High School, and then went on to Sexton High School where I graduated in 1971.

When I was 15 years old I started attending Maple Grove Baptist Church where I met my future wife. She was the church organist at the time and also one of the Sunday School teachers there. I soon became the President of the church Youth Group and a member of the choir. Sometimes I sang duets with a buddy of mine for the morning or evening services. She and I were just friends for the first 2 years, but one day, out of the clear blue sky, we started seeing each other differently. One evening, a group of the young folks were working on a Youth Group project down at the church and afterwards she asked if I wanted a ride home in her 1964 Mustang. Keep in mind that I only lived 3 blocks from the church and had walked down there that evening in the first place! But of course I said "Yes!" and a few minutes later we kissed for the first time in my parents' driveway! We "went steady" for 2 years and then were engaged for a year. After spending a couple of years at Bible College (Grand Rapids School of the Bible and Music), we got married on August 11, 1973 in the same church where we first met!

My interest in Amateur Radio came by accident when I stumbled across a SKYWARN Net one day at the age of 40. You see, I knew nothing of Ham Radio when I was growing up since I had no family, friends or neighbors who were Hams and I regret not finding out about it sooner as I've missed so many years of fun. Back in college, one of my roommates had a multi-band radio with public safety, CB, and a couple of shortwave bands on it and that got me interested in communications monitoring. When I got married a few years later, I just HAD to get a scanner and a shortwave radio—but I still would not discover Ham Radio until years later! Starting in 1991, I spent about three years in CB experimenting with two-way radio, but after that chance encounter with a SKYWARN Net later on in 1993, I began constantly monitoring the 145.39 repeater to see if I could glean ANY information about Ham Radio from the airwaves. I had questions like: what the heck is Ham Radio any way?; do I need a license?; what study manual do I need and where do I get it?; where do I test when I'm ready and if there's a local Club, where the heck is it?

It took what seemed like forever to gather together all these bits and pieces of information about the Hobby and then put them to use. I studied hard, and although I did have the option of entering Ham Radio as a "No-code Tech", I wanted instead to come in as an old-fashioned Technician, or what later was called a "Tech Plus" or "Tech w/HF". So, finally in 1993 I passed the Novice and Technician written examinations in Howell and a week later shot over to Charlotte to pass my 5 WPM CW examination. You couldn't get your callsign off an FCC database back then and just begin operating—no siree, you had to receive your paper license in the mail BEFORE you were legally an Amateur Radio operator! I remember there was some kind of bottleneck going on at the FCC at that time and what nowadays can often take as little as 3 days to get off the Internet took me 3 MONTHS to get in the mail!! About 4 years later (during breaks at work) I studied like crazy and in about a month's time went from being a Tech Plus to passing the General written, the 13 WPM CW, the Advanced written and the Extra written examinations! It took 8 more months before passing the 20 WPM CW examination and achieving the final license status of "Amateur Extra"! The Lord gets ALL the credit for this one because CW at 20 WPM was one of the biggest challenges of my life, what with the 14 prescriptions I was on at the time!

My wife got her Technician Plus license a couple of years after I was first licensed, and a few years later went on to earn her General Class license. Over the years, we have served together on the Board of Directors of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club and the Lansing Civil Defense Repeater Association and have participated in many other Ham Radio activities together. Amateur Radio has given us yet one more facet of life

that we can share and has in many ways drawn us closer. Today, I am involved in the inner workings of Ham Radio in a variety of ways. I am CMARC's Vice President, CMARC's "Club Contact Person", CMARC's "New Ham Ambassador", and CMARC's "Youth Liaison". I am also a Director on LCDRA's Board and the Assistant Emergency Coordinator for the Net Control position at the Lansing/Ingham ARPSC. In addition, I am an active Volunteer Examiner for the Ingham County VE Group, a certified SKYWARN Spotter and I am RACEScertified. A while back, I became very unhappy with the reality that there were people wanting to become Hams but couldn't, simply because they were unable to afford the expensive study manuals. So, about 3 ½ years ago I decided to remedy the situation by starting a License Manual Lending Library which is stocked with up-to-date donated Technician, General and Extra class books. As the owner of the books, I make sure they are loaned out and distributed to those in need. About 5 years ago I wanted to increase the social activity in our local Ham community, so I started a weekly gathering for Hams, their families and friends which has met at a local restaurant every Saturday night since without fail. This "Coffee Break" has truly been a hit!

You might say I'm a little bit involved with the local Net scene. Over 4 years ago I was appointed as the Coordinator for the Lansing/Ingham ARPSC RACES Training Net. About 2 ½ years ago, I took an old Net that had been abandoned, changed its name, its format and the day and time it met and created the Mid-Michigan Information Net which I run every Wednesday night at 7:00pm on the 145.39 repeater. It's a casual rag-chew Net with Ham-related announcements sprinkled throughout. And well over 2 ½ years ago, in order to generate some activity in the morning, I also started a daily Net which I run from 7:00am until Noon or so, Monday through Friday, called the "Breakfast Club Net". With EchoLink enabled (thanks to Dan/NE8K), we usually have an average every morning of 90 people that check in from all around the world and I put between 100 and 130 hours into running this Net every month.

In case you're wondering, in spite of my health problems, I do all the things I do every day for Ham Radio because I love the Hobby and everyone in it! And, I just want to give something back to Amateur Radio because of all that it has given to me. CMARC has been my home and it (along with all the other organizations I belong to, including the ARRL) has given me the opportunity to serve my fellow Hams and my community. And although the many services I provide are done out of the goodness of my heart without the expectation of anything in return, on May 11, 2012 at the annual CMARC Ladies Night Banquet, I was presented the Ziegenbein Award. Receiving this prestigious award is something that I never expected in a million years! I am very honored and humbled to be counted among those who, down through the years, have been the very pillars of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club. THANK YOU to all who nominated me and to the members of the Ziegenbein Committee for their decision.

I have much more to say about my favorite parts of Ham Radio, my equipment, etc., but that's for a different time and place, since I'm running out of room here! So then, now that we have become a little better acquainted, "What's My Sign?" My Callsign is KB8RAD and my name is Don McLain, CMARC's Vice President. My wife is Julie McLain/KB8ZXR.

## ARPSC Meeting Minutes Monday May 21, 2012 Lansing EOC

**RACES Cards** – Those that have new RACES cards need to get theirs from Lansing Fire Station #8. There are four new RACES members.

**Field Day (6-23 to 24)** – 4 weeks away. There are many donations from businesses for food and other help. If you know of places that would be willing to donate ice, hamburger patties, table paper, etc: get in contact with Jim.

Holt Festival (8-25-12) - 7a-10p. More information is to come soon.

**MSU Football games –** ATV will be used in first 4-5 home games. Those doing ATV will need to take a class for tethering as we will be on the stadium roof and a dorm roof. MSU likes the capabilities of the ATV units, and hope to use them into the future. Those interested in this are urged to get trained in tethering so that there will be more ATV operators available for these games. Viewing the video that Dennis sent out is the first part of training. Training should be available at the first active ATV game.

**Lansing Marathon** – Race went pretty well with no major injuries. It was difficult getting the ATV kits running in the beginning of the marathon. It will be necessary to get out ahead of the event so that we are better prepared and ready to go. Communication went very well by report. Our RACES group dispatched the CERT teams. For events like these, make sure to brush up on the Incident Command System.

**Lansing Police –** Two cameras were setup in a parking ramp during a protest and video was recorded. LPD is starting to use ATV more frequently.

**Common Ground (July 9-15) –** Volunteers are needed to cover the four stations for each of the days. The more volunteers we have, the less time each member needs to volunteer. Please contact Jim if you can help.

**CF walk dewitt riverfront park (June 3) –** 3 more volunteers needed starting at noon.

CERT - has asked us to dispatch their next two events from Fire Station #1 (LCC).

- Fireworks (July 4)

**Skywarn** – The three teams are still working in a rotating basis to offer net control and net decision making coverage. Could still use more volunteers at the EOC during storms.


**ATV** – Some maintenance is needed, but all kits are working.


