


Change

What's My Sign?

I was born on June 7, 1969 in Lansing, Michigan and have one sister, Brenda. My Dad was a Mental Health advocate, creating community resource centers and my Mom worked in a copy machine sales office. Even though my father served in the Navy during the late 1950's and worked with radios in communications, he never became interested in the Amateur Radio hobby. In 1987 I graduated from Williamston High School and went on to LCC. It was a tough six years, but I received my Associates Degree in Media Technology from Lansing Community College. The length of schooling was due to getting my first broadcast radio jobs in the late 1980s. After that I followed in my father's footsteps and chose to work in the Mental Health field, setting up and maintaining community resource centers for persons with a mental health illness.

I am a single father with two beautiful daughters and one really cool son. My oldest daughter, Chelsea, is 19 and is in her second year of college, my daughter Samantha is 15 and is in 11th grade and my son Andrew is 10 years old and is in the 6th grade. Right now, he's the only one in my family that's really interested in Amateur Radio and he even has his own scanner that he listens to all the time. He's had fun making some Third Party HF contacts with me, and loves checking into as many of the Nets on the 145.39 repeater as he can. I met my sweetheart, Stephanie, at church. She has a daughter, Mariah, who is 16 years old and in the 11th grade and a son Alex who is 13 years old and in the 8th grade.

My interest in Amateur Radio all began, when as a scanner monitor, I came across the Ham Radio bands and as I listened, I became curious about what it was all about. That interest grew more and more after hearing the Breakfast Club Net...it was driving me nuts as KB8RAD would call out for check-ins and I was unable to call in. Then I began listening to the SKYWARN nets and all the various people participating made me want to get my license even more, as I really wanted to participate. Finally, in 2010, I attended the Lansing Area/Ingham County ARPSC SKYWARN training at LCC's West Campus and was guided in the right direction by a few licensed operators. Later on that year, I took and passed my first Technician Class exam at a special testing session of the Ingham County VE Group that was held at Gardner Middle School in Lansing, Michigan during CMARC's Field Day 2010. Then in 2011, at the Ingham County Sheriff's Office in Mason, during a regular testing session of the Ingham County VE Group, I took and passed my General Class exam and am currently a General Class licensee.

In my shack I have a 2-meter Kenwood D710a as my base rig, an ICOM v-8000 as a backup rig, and an ICOM 210H as my mobile rig. I have a Yaesu FT-60 HT that I also use in the car just for short trips. For HF I have a Kenwood TS480SAT, which gives me 100 watts without an amp. As antennas go, for my base antenna I have a Workman UVS 300 17-foot vertical antenna with the top at 45 feet. For HF I have 3 Inverted Vee "ugly dipoles" about 20 feet high in my apple trees. I also have an Alpha Antenna 6160 J-Pole strung from the house to the pear tree 70 feet behind the house. When it comes to my favorite Band, it's kind of like comparing apples and oranges. I really enjoy the conversations on 2-meters, but also really enjoy the challenge and variety of HF. Another part of the Hobby that I really enjoy is SKYWARN, as I've always had an interest in the weather. I am also a current member of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club and enjoy attending the monthly meetings, as much as possible.

Besides the wonderful Hobby of Amateur Radio, I also enjoy working with kids, either in the church or on the ball fields. Kids are our future and they need us to give them the attention and guidance required to move them in the right direction. I also enjoy photography in the areas of people, Great Lakes freighters, and beautiful landscapes.

Finally, when asked if I had any comments that I'd like to share with the Club regarding this great Hobby, I replied, "Share the fun in this Hobby with your friends and children. It's a great way to enjoy Amateur Radio and learn more about it, as you pass the knowledge on to other prospective Hams."

Earlier in the week Ned and Nil got together to try to work a currently operating DX-pedition. Nil had put them "in the log" a few eves earlier and Ned just wasn't able to break through from his station. They fire up the rig and listen up....... Yes, there's the pileup. Well our boy Ned chimes right in with his call. The DX comes back to another, and another, fer 15 minutes. Then, Ned disguises his voice to sound like a Sheila. He throws out his call like a little lass. He listens, and sure enough the DX comes back to Ned, the exchanges are made, and as Nil looks on with a smile, Ned reluctantly accepts "the power" of the female voice on the air. But not to be out done, chimes in quickly with "but just try to do that with CW!" Nil agrees, "no advantage there. Just operator skill."

The rest of the meeting went uneventful till the end. Overhear a couple o' timers arguing over who has the better station. One had a 3 element Yagi-Uda up about 15 metres. The other a 2 element Cubical Quad at about 10 metres. They were getting quite heated about it all, each telling of signal reports from the various DX-peditions on of late, each bragging of multiple awards and 1st place finishes in this or that contest. Each believing that HIS station was of the highest caliber. Well two old friends almost got into a tussle over it all. Figured I'd better step in before it came to blows!

"Truth is your both right". That got em to simmer for a bit. "Gents, remember you are comparing 2 entirely different stations". "Now Harv, your quad is a 2 element multi-band job up about 10 metres overlooking a large pond. And Gus, you have a 3 element Yagi up about 15 metres." "It's like trying to compare a croc and snapping turtle. Both have a nasty bite, but they're still entirely different critters." "In fact some blokes have large antenna farms and lavish new equipment that oft times doesn't play any better than a dipole at another's QTH." "The aerial and it's roll in station performance is often the weakest link in the chain. Consider the fact that many QRP "low power" ops routinely work worldwide DX with only a handful of watts. These ops are continually tweeking and improving their antenna systems for optimal performance. These guys many times spend more on coax than on the aerial itself, trying to get every precious milliwatt out into the aerial where it will do the most good."


"So who has the better station? You both do!" "Each station has some pluses and some minuses." "While the Quad is a bit lower, it has more gain at lower elevation than the Yagi. The Quad has more capture area, and may give a slight advantage on receive. The Yagi on the other hand will usually have the superior front to back ratio. Both station apparently do well in the contests and casual operation. The answer here is that the two stations may be very similar in performance. The real factor may be the HUMAN FACTOR." "more often than power or rig, it is the operator skill that is the difference." "Looks as though we may have a tie here gents. I suggest we find ways of improving your stations capabilities rather than bickering." They agreed, but still longing for friendly competition, decided to enter the next contest to battle it out in the either.
