5. The same person can receive the award more than once.

8. If the Committee feels the nominees are not deserving, the award does not have to be given.
9. Nominations are to be submitted before March 15th of each year, so the Committee can make the selection and have the plaque engraved.
10. The recipient will be announced at the annual Ladies' Night.

# What's My Sign?

I was born on Tuesday, February 26, 1952 in Jackson, Michigan and was the first of four children. My Dad was working for a farmer at the time and did so for a while after I was born. My parents had been married for three years already and were thinking of adopting one of their foster kids, when I came along. Then, just three days before I celebrated my fourth birthday, my parents brought home from the hospital a little baby brother. Wow, what a birthday present! That's when we moved into a little 2-bedroom house trailer on my maternal grandparents' farm on Plains Road in Eaton Rapids. Two years later, another brother came along and that's when my Dad and Grandpa built our three-bedroom ranch home on the empty lot right next door—complete with a cement basement where we could play on rainy or cold winter days! Well, things were just about as good as they could get until two days after my eighth birthday my parents brought home the baby sister I had always wanted and our family was complete!

I had a lot of fun growing up, because I lived next door to my grandparents, who I adored, and I loved helping Grandpa feed the pigs and chickens on his farm. Because my cousins all lived within a mile of each other, we played together day and night, always ending the summer days by playing "Hide and Seek" at Grandpa's. When I was five, I walked two miles every day to a 1-room school house for Kindergarten. It was the same school that my Mom and her 5 siblings went to many years before, and with the very same Teacher, too! I went to King Street Elementary for the 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> grades, and then on to Northwestern Elementary for 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup>. I spent the 6<sup>th</sup> grade at Union Street Elementary, and on to King Street Junior High School for the 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades. Finally, I moved on to Eaton Rapids High School on Plains Road, a little over a mile from where I used to live, where I graduated in 1970. Go, Greyhounds!!

My Dad had really bad back problems, which kept him from getting a lot of jobs he'd applied for, so one day (with three kids to feed and a fourth on the way), he decided he needed to do something different for the rest of his life and went to Barber College in Detroit. I was eight-years old and my sister was only three-months old around the time he graduated with his Barber's License. He worked in Albion for a while and then in the Fall of '65 we moved from our 1-acre home in Eaton Rapids to a fifty-acre farm in Dimondale, where he secured a job as a full-time Barber until he retired over 20 years later. As you might guess, we four kids weren't quite as excited about moving as Mom and Dad were, but with promises of still being able to go to Eaton Rapids Schools, still seeing our cousins, and getting a PONY, we made the move!

I was a "county" girl long before we moved to the "picky weeds" of Dimondale, but even so, it was a little upsetting when we moved from a more modern house to a much older farm house with spiders crawling around all over the place—including my bed! Then there were the mice surprising you in the damp Michigan basement, snakes in the yard (even if they were only garter snakes!!), and did I say spiders? ICK! But the one good thing out of it all was when we started going to a new church closer to where we lived and I joined the Youth Group there. That's where in 1968, I met the sweetest, cutest boy I have ever had the pleasure to know and WOW, what blue eyes...well, that's when I finally made peace with moving and began going steady!!

After graduating from High School, I worked as a clerk/typist for a year at MSU in the Engineering Building. One of the many things I had to do each day was make coffee in the lounge on second floor, just around the corner from the Amateur Radio Station!! I would always look in as I walked by wondering what they were doing in there!! Now I know! The next year, my steady and I both went to the Grand Rapids School of the Bible and Music (GRSBM) for 2 years, working part-time jobs to pay our way through college. I lived in the girl's dorm right on campus and worked in our school's Printing Department doing various jobs. At one time I even worked as the School's Head Printer for a while. My sweetheart lived across town in the boy's dorm and worked in a factory on the afternoon shift, which got out around 11pm. Because of the hours he had to work, he missed out on most of the school's fun activities. Oh, and speaking of fun activities, did I mention that I and my steady boyfriend (the same one I met at church in 1968) got engaged in the summer of '72? WOW, those were exciting times!

After our time at GRSBM, we moved back to our parent's homes (where we insisted on paying rent), and eventually got jobs. We saved and saved in order to get married, which we finally did on Saturday, August 11, 1973!! Shortly after we married my husband got a shortwave radio and we began listening to broadcast stations around the world. It was great fun and that led him to buying a Police scanner which caused him to stumble across a SKYWARN Net and AMATEUR RADIO!! After discovering such a wonderful thing, my husband just HAD to get his ticket! After seeing all the fun that he and his friends were having with Ham Radio, two years after he was licensed I took the plunge and in 1995 I passed my Novice and Technician written exams at a testing session in Owosso. A little later on I passed my 5 WPM Morse Code in Charlotte. I joined CMARC right away and became the Club Secretary for about 5 years, also joining LCDRA and serving as their Secretary for several years, as well. A few years ago I upgraded to General Class and then became a Volunteer Examiner with the "Ingham County VE Group". I am also a member of the Lansing/Ingham Amateur Radio Public Service Corps and am RACES certified.

You can usually find me on 2-meters checking into one of the many great Nets out on the 145.39 repeater, and even running my OWN Net for over five and a half years now. My husband and I share most of our equipment, but I do have my own dual-band Alinco DJ-580, a Yaesu 2-meter FT-11 and a blue dual-band Baofeng UV-3R. In addition to Ham Radio, my hobbies include reading, counted cross-stitch, knitting and crocheting.

When asked if I had any words of wisdom to pass along or any comments or suggestions about CMARC or Ham Radio, I could only come up with this: "We each only have a few years to live, and this planet is currently the only place we have to live on, so we should treat everyone like WE want to be treated, live each day like it was our LAST and treat the Earth like it was REALLY our home. As far as Ham Radio and CMARC go, our Hobby is the best there is because it's all about people, and CMARC is the best there is because there I've met the best people in the world!"

There, now that we've become a little better acquainted, "What's My Sign?" My Callsign is KB8ZXR and my name is Julie McLain. My husband's name is Don McLain and a lot of people around the world have heard of KB8RAD!
