What's My Sign?

I was born on January 23, 1948 in Lansing, Michigan and was the second of seven children, four boys and three girls. My Dad worked as a Timekeeper at Oldsmobile and my Mom worked as a clerk for the State of Michigan. In 1966 I graduated from Monsignor John O'Rafferty High School in Lansing and then attended Lansing Community College from 1966 to 1968. Then, from 1968 to 1970, I attended Michigan State University, graduating in 1970 with a degree in Electrical Engineering. I had a lot of fun growing up in Lansing, like playing "Tag" with my siblings till it got dark, going to drive-in theaters, and I really enjoyed the amusement park at Lake Lansing. I also have special memories of having our milk delivered to our neighborhood by a milkman in a horse-drawn wagon, and celebrating Lansing's Centennial with a torch-light parade and with special 50 cent coins.

My interest in Amateur Radio started well before the age of scanners, and came about as I listened to our family's old radio that also received Short Wave. I was hooked! I heard different Hams out on the air waves and wanted to be able to communicate just like them. To hear better, I put up various antennas in our small city lot. My best friend was a Ham, Roger Phillips KZ8W, who lived in my neighborhood. It was his uncle that administered the Novice test for me shortly after my 17th birthday. Well, I passed and was licensed as WN8PHC in February of 1965.

In 1982, when on a Boy Scout camping trip with Larry Galvin and Mike Manning N8EUQ, I overheard some Morse Code as Mike was studying for his General Class License and I mentioned I could copy it! Evidently, my skill at CW had already advanced to the General Class level. After some studying I tested again and advanced from Novice to Extra in one year's time, upgrading to General Class at Dayton and then getting my Extra and 20 words per minute CW in Detroit with the FCC.

In my shack I have a Kenwood TS-430S transceiver feeding an Alpha Delta off-center fed Multi-band Antenna, and for VHF I use a Yaesu VX-5. You can hear me out on the 145.39 from time to time, but my favorite place to be is on 40 Meters Single Side Band. In 1965, I built my first transmitter, a Knight Kit T-60 which was a kit-built CW and AM transmitter. I haven't been as active in the Hobby as I'd like to be, and so haven't been using CW for a while now, but I still really enjoy copying code when I can. I've recently become interested in the digital modes, but haven't tried them yet. I do enjoy checking into Nets and my favorite one is "The 3905 Century Club Worked All States and Awards Net". I am an active member of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club and the Quarter Century Wireless Association. I served as CMARC's Membership Chairman from 1985 to 2011. In addition to my Amateur Radio Hobby, I have been actively doing Genealogy for the last 46 years, and also belong to the Knights of Columbus and Eagles.

I met my sweetheart at a Christian Singles Club in Okemos, and on May 21, 1977 we were married. Pamela and I have two beautiful daughters, Jessica and Angela who have both recently blessed us with Grandsons! Jessica had a son on July 12, 2012 and Angela had a son on July 15, 2012. They were in the Hospital together. Our grandson's names are Logan and Tyler and they are both 8-months old! I am retired now, but previously worked for AT&T as a Long Distance Switching Equipment Technician.


