What's My Sign?

I was born on June 18, 1927 at Unionville, Michigan and had eleven siblings! My Dad was a rural mail carrier and farmer. My Mom had a full-time job "at home" taking care of me and my five brothers and six sisters! (All five of my brothers were in the Navy/Maritime Service during World War II and one of my brothers was killed in 1943 when his destroyer was torpedoed by the Germans. There is now only me and three of my sisters left.)

After graduating from Unionville High School in 1944, at the age of 16, I went to Detroit where I joined the Merchant Marine in July of that same year. After boot camp I went to Radio School at Hoffman Island in New York and in March of 1945 I joined a merchant ship as 3rd Radio Officer in San Francisco. In the fall of 1947 I began college at Michigan State University, graduating as an Electrical Engineer in 1951, and receiving my Master's degree in 1954. During the summers, I sailed as a Radio Officer in the Merchant Marine to earn the money I needed to go to college.

In 1958 I moved to Cocoa Beach, Florida (where I still live) to take a job with the General Electric Company. They had the Guidance System contract for the Atlas/Gemini rockets and I was a Guidance Engineer, so I worked at Cape Canaveral (later known as "Cape Kennedy"), where I met and worked with the "Original Seven Heroes" who flew the Atlas and Gemini flights. After 20 years, our guidance system program ended and so I went back to sea as a Radio Officer, sailing in the Merchant Marine.

My interest in Amateur Radio started back in 1944 when I was only 17 years old. I became acquainted with some Ham Radio operators who seemed to have no problem operating Morse code and they knew a lot about the theory, too! So, with their encouragement, I decided to get busy and I started to learn Morse code. Where it was so very "easy" for these Hams that I'd met, I had "difficulty" mastering the code and learning about the theory!! But I kept going!! When I began attending Michigan State University in 1947, I met some more Hams and joined the Radio Club at MSU. It was during the fall/winter of 1947, at the age of 20, that I took my first license exam to become a Radio Amateur. Even though I already had my "Commercial Radio Operator License", I still had to take the exam for my Amateur Radio License and to do this I had to drive from Lansing to the FCC Office in Detroit. One year later, I had to go through it all over again when I upgraded to the next higher class license. Then, when it came time for me to take my Extra exam, four of us drove to the Federal Building in Miami, Florida...leaving at 3am to make sure we could be there by 9am to test. One of our friends who could normally copy at least 30 WPM failed the Morse code test when he "froze up"! The poor guy tried another 3 to 4 times and failed each time. He finally got his Extra when the rules were changed on how you could pass your 20 WPM code. Now, with the new rule change you could either fill in the blanks, or get one minute of solid copy.

As you can see, Radio has been a huge part of my life...as a Commercial Radio Operator, for my pleasure as a Radio Operator with the Merchant Marine, and as a Ham Radio Operator. As an avid radio "nut", I've always been able to keep in touch with my Hobby both from home and while sailing. Around the end of 1960 I switched over to strictly CW, after I had several bad experiences with phone ops who were the really nasty types. Their swearing, intentional interference and more made me give up using the phone mode.

Back in the late '60s, I was able to work every country in the mixed mode, but in 2012 I couldn't make a "clean

sweep" as North Korea couldn't be worked on CW. At one time, I was avid on high speed operation using 60 WPM or more for communication. I also had a great interest in participating with DXpedition groups who operated from rare places for the purpose of getting on the air. It was always fun too, operating from these DX locations and helping to give a "new country" to those Hams who were chasing for new ones. I used to be very keen on "CW Contesting" operating as "VQ9QM" and it was always enjoyable trying to keep up with some of the better equipped stations. At one time, we had a club station that had a 90 foot tower with a multi-band beam plus wire antennas. For approximately 14 years, we were stationed in Diego Garcia and over the years, I logged approximately 100,000 contacts. It was almost "pure heaven" as here I was operating from a rare QTH and was earning good money doing something that I loved.

At the age of 86, I can't complain too much, because I had a good run for my "money". Unfortunately, almost 3 years ago I came down with "Shingles" which is very painful and I can't use my sending arm except for only very short periods. A few months ago I took my tower and antennas down and gave away all my equipment. Over the years, I've had a lot of fun and enjoyment and I'm fortunate I lasted as long as I did. I've also met a lot of Hams in my life and I still keep in contact with a few of my long term Ham friends!

Back during my college days at MSU, I was a member of the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club. And I really enjoyed helping with the classes they held for CW and for Theory. Over the years, I have met some wonderful people through Ham radio, both around the world and right there at CMARC. My hope is that the Central Michigan Amateur Radio Club will continue to be the viable organization that it has always been.

There, now that we're a little better acquainted, "What's My Sign?" My Callsign is W4QM and my name is Harmon "Dale" Strieter.

RAD's COFFEE BREAK



Building the C.A.T interface for the CMARC shack computers

With the recent interest in contesting from the CMARC "shack" I decided to build a computer Interface to help with logging during contest operation.

For simplicity I choose "Manhattan Style" building in case I had to experiment a bit to get the rig to "talk" to the computer. The circuit only has 1 chip and a handful of parts to make it work.


1st step, mount the chip socket to the PCB, bending the feet out to provide room to mount parts.





 2^{nd} step, mount the 5 caps, 1 diode, 3 resistors, 2 LED's, and connectors. 3^{rd} step, finding an encloser. I had some extra Ten Tec style boxes in my "junk box", so I started drilling the holes for the jacks and LED's.





4th step, mount the competed unit into its new home, and test!

Total build time was about 3 hours.

Hope you enjoyed the pix, and hope you'll be inspired to build one for your own.

Does any of this register with you? Or maybe there is an old timer in your club that remembers who this ham was? Any help you can give me would be appreciated.


