Working DX, It's Easier Than You Think

've been listening to several local hams complain about the sunspot cycle these days, and that Ol' Sol just doesn't seem to be working very hard as of late. I gather that many of the DXers out there just aren't able to get enough good juicy DX these days. Yes, it's true that we are on the downward side of the sunspot cycle, and that the ionosphere isn't getting the proper pasting that some hams think it should be getting to get that signal

to bounce all the way to Timbucktoo, but all is not dismal. Even in a declining sunspot cycle, there are a lot of foreign stations out there wanting to hear from you. The DX is still there, you just have to work a tad harder and smarter to bag that elusive ham on the other side of the world. I've had my share of DX contacts this year, and I haven't even really tried very hard. The secret? Being on the air when the DX station is operating, for one. Being willing to wait for a good day of propagation is another. That old saying about patience is a virtue, is especially true in Ham Radio.

Don't be afraid to adjust your operating schedule a bit. Many times just staying up after 11pm or midnight may make the difference. Also if you're an early riser like me, there's a lot of good DX lurking on the "grayline" at 6am.

Another hint. Don't be afraid to try calling a CQ on the next higher band, even if it sounds "dead". I've had several very satisfying QSO's on 15 meters when there was not a peep on the band until I called CQ.

Finally, get on regularly. You can't work much for DX if you operate only on Tuesday nights. Try working on the weekends. In many other

parts of the world, the weekends are the only times you may hear the other station on the air. They may have to work 5 or 6 days a week.

Want to work 100 countries quickly? Jump into one of the major contests. ARRL DX, or CQWW, can net you DXCC in one weekend.

You say you don't have a big fancy tower or antenna system? Not to worry. Plenty of good catches to be had out there with modest antennas and low power. Still have doubts? I'm living proof! OK here's a list of just some of the DX "catches" that have made it into the log this summer. All with under 100 watts, and dipole antennas, many with only 5 watts, and a couple with only 1 watt. Yes 1 watt and I bagged France, Columbia, Cuba, and Mexico. These 1 watt QSO's are often a testament to the DX operators skill. Here's the list, and summers not over yet!

Hungary, Belgium, USSR, Ecuador, Philippines, Finland, Japan, Australia, Haiti, Tonga, Columbia ,France, Cayman Is., Germany, Curacao, Marquesas, Lithuania, Cuba, Sweden, Mexico, Brazil, Chile, Slovenia, Canada, Venezuela, Italy, Iceland, Latvia, Ireland, Poland, Belarus, Israel, American Samoa, New Zealand, and Nicaragua. Wow! That's 35 DXCC entities in a summer (3 months) without even breaking a sweat! 1/3 the way to DXCC in a summer!

Now I know that there are those who say that I have spent a lot of time on the air to work these QSO's, yes, but who cares? That's half the fun! The other half is when that rare one answers YOU! That's the thrill that keeps 'em coming back for more.

So don't be discouraged, and don't despair, turn on the radio and call CQ! You never know who will answer you today!

CMARC Puzzle Page

Samurai Sudoku

I have seen several other radio clubs in the country that include some kind of puzzle in their monthly newsletters. Since this month's issue will be lighter than normal, I figure it would be a good time to try it out. Please feel free to comment on whether or not you like the idea of a monthly puzzle. There are several variations of Sudoku with varying levels of difficulty. This puzzle is at the easy or very easy level.

One piece of advise when trying to solve this type of Sudoku.

You can not solve it by trying to solve each of the five 3x3 grids individually, but by working all five grids together.

Samurai Sudoku puzzles consist of five overlapping grids. The standard sudoku rules apply to each 9x9 grid. Place digits from 1 to 9 in each empty cell. Every row, every column, and every 3x3 box should contain one of each digit. There is only one solution to the puzzle, and all you need to use in pure Logic. Guesses are not required.






