Nomination Guidelines

- 3. All nominations are to be kept secret until the award is presented.
- 4. All nominations are to be mailed (regular postal mail OR email).
- 5. The same person can receive the award more than once.
- 6. The Committee shall consist of the last three recipients; the senior member shall be the chairman.
- 7. All nominations are to be closely checked and discussed by the Committee.
- 8. If the Committee feels the nominees are not deserving, the award does not have to be given.
- 9. Nominations are to be submitted before *March 15th* of each year, so the Committee can make the selection and have the plaque engraved.
- 10. The recipient will be announced at the annual Ladies' Night.



More "Dumb and Dumber"

ast year I penned an article in the SCOPE about the "dumbing down" of our hobby. Much of the complaint was about our current Question Pool for the amateur exams. I would hope that the future exams would be a bit more electrically challenging.

Many of our electrical engineering students in America are falling behind when it comes to learning anything

about electronics. This not only has me wondering about the quality of engineers we are graduating but also about the quality of the work they will do in their "careers."

The ARRL is not helping matters any either. In a recent review of a kit project in the August 2016 issue of QST, we are told by an ARRL staffer, about resister identification. We are told to lay out all the resistors on a piece of double sided tape mounted on a piece of paper and measure them with an Ohm-meter, then write down the value for easy identification. These guys all must have gotten their degrees from the same university, LAZY U! What ever happened to "memorizing" the resistor color code? It isn't rocket science folks. It's 10 numbers and 10 colors! I did it in about an hour. Both my kids did it at 9 and 11 years old, in about 15 minutes. We all had to learn our ABC's, we all had to learn how to do our "times tables," didn't we? What could be simpler? Apparently looking it up on Google passes for knowledge these days. Oh yes, I've heard all the excuses. None worth repeating here.

If you want to use that Ohm-meter to "verify a suspected foul one," this is a good way, but to use it, because you don't want to learn the


Color Code is sheer nonsense. What happens when your Multimeter battery runs down?

It sickens me to no end to see "nearly half" of the students leaving with an EE degree, do NOT know the resistor color code. (some, not much about electronics either for that matter) Why not? Only one reason, LAZY. That's right, LAZY! The students are too lazy to learn it, and faculty too lazy to teach it. It's numbers and profit that drives the educational machine these days and integrity has gone by the wayside. It's a shame; we used to be number 1 in the world. Can we make that claim today? Where will we be tomorrow? What do you think? Will you contribute to making it better? Or just watch from the sidelines......

And yes I'm complaining! Because I know we can do better!
