



Ham researcher to investigate effects of solar eclipse

August 21 is a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for many in the U.S. to see a total eclipse. It's also an opportunity for a team of Virginia Tech researchers to study the effects of the eclipse onchanges in the upper atmosphere that have an impact

onHF propagation and the global positioning system (GPS). Backed by research funding from NASA and the National Science foundation, the team is headed by Dr. Greg Earle, W4GDE.

The Virginia Tech team plans to gather data from a variety of sources, including radar systems, transceivers, satellites, ham radio, and GPS receivers, in order to analyze the effects of the solar eclipse on the conductive region of the atmosphere.

"Whether military radar, or consumer GPS signals, the eclipse is going to have effects on the medium that we would like to understand better, so that we can either mitigate them or use them to our advantage," said Earle.

Let's party!

In conjunction with the eclipse, the HamSCI and the ARRL are sponsoring the Solar Eclipse QSO Party (http://www.hamsci.org/seqp). (SEQP). According to an article in the August 2017 issue of QST, the goal of the SEQP is to "flood the airwaves with contacts, all measured by the automated receiver networks of the Reverse Beacon Network, PSKReporter, and WSPRNet." Once all the logs are in, researchers will analyze the data to see what effect the eclipse had on radio propagation.

The SEQP will run from 1400Z - 2200Z on Monday, August 21. This is well before the eclipse is due to begin on the West Coast. The reason it starts before the eclipse is to establish a baseline for radio propagation conditions.

SEQP organizers urge you to make as many contacts as you can on as many bands as you can operate. Like nearly every contest, contacts are not allowed on 60m, 30m, 17m, and 12m. CW, RTTY, and PSK31 are the preferred modes because automated receivers can record those contacts, but phone and other digital modes count, too.

An interesting twist to this contest is that, like Field Day, you can earn a number of bonus points, including:

- * Operating outdoors (100 points)
- * Operating in a public place (100 points)
- * Operating a wide-band automated receiver at your station (100 points)

Hams have had a long history of supporting scientific research. They provided communications for some of the early polar explorations and listened for Sputnik as it flew overhead. The Solar Eclipse QSO Party continues this tradition, and it's going to be a lot of fun as well. Visit the HamSCI website (http://www.hamsci.org/seqp) for more information.



CMARC Board Meeting Minutes

July 8, 2017

1) Call to Order:

a) Club Vice President Russ Fitzgerald/N8FZ called the meeting to order at 5:40 pm.

2) Discussions:

- a) Ted Sadilek/WA8MFQ discovered that both of the club callsigns (W8MAA and W8PLP) are set to expire in November. The Board will figure out who needs to renew them, either someone on the Board or the Trustee who was assigned the individual callsigns. Russ Fitzgerald/N8FZ we need to change or update who the Trustee(s) will be, either the President or the Secretary.
- b) Russ Fitzgerald/N8FZ gave a brief recap of this year's Field Day. He mentioned Clyde Tompkins/K8CPT ran the GOTA station this year and made about 15 contacts with the youngest person about 7 years old. He said there were about half as many people there for the picnic this year compared to last year. We need to find a way to promote the picnic much more than we had done this year. He said we should not worry so much about making contacts, but to welcome in new people who may stop into visit each station location.
- c) Russ Fitzgerald/N8FZ discussed the upcoming club meetings. He said in order to make our meetings happen we will need help. There are many members who are very talented in different areas of Ham Radio. He would like to identify those who are "experts" in their fields, and ask to come in and give a presentation. It may also be beneficial to our membership if we had a list of designated Elmers who other members could call if they need help in a specific area. He will present this idea to the membership at the August meeting to see if there is any interest.
- d) Sam Fitzgerald/N8FPR discussed some upcoming events that he is excited about and needs our help with. He has recently been put in charge of planning camping and other events for the Boy Scouts. He is looking for ideas for upcoming scouting events. One idea he did have was to use one of our club meetings as a time and place for Scouts to come and get their radio merit badges. He needs a person who is certified in teaching the class to run the meeting. Another idea he had was to conduct a CW crash course, of course he will need someone to put that on as well. His whole goal is to start simple and work up to larger things as he becomes more comfortable.
 - i) He also discussed he would like to begin with the Radio Merit Badge Blitz. Depending on how much interest he receives from this event, will determine what other events we do in the future.
 Radio Merit Badges are a great way to get Scouts to come out because many of them are looking to get as many badges as possible.
 - ii) If someone is interested in helping conduct a presentation, please feel free to see him at a meeting or send him an email. There is a very small window of opportunity to hold meetings or events.
- e) Russ Fitzgerald/N8FZ shared some concerns he has with our new location. If we continue to have large attendance to our meetings, like we had last month, we will quickly run out of space. He would like to Board to consider the possibility of removing the tables for the meeting, and set up rows of chairs. Parking will also become an issue with the more people we have. He asked if we could park along the long driveway at the welding business across the street. He also mentioned he has gathered all the license plates we have given him so far, and wants to begin building a template.
- f) Clyde Tompkins/K8CPT gave an update on Hamfest. He said we are currently set for volunteers but still need someone to head up the food. Dan Dymbinski will not be able to be there this year due to health reasons and will not be supplying us with the pulled pork that he has in previous years. Because of this we are going to have Burgers, Brats, and Hot Dogs. It will be nice to have a windbreak that the cooks

can place around the grills to help cut down on the wind that blows through. Joe Urdzella, John Tyree, Sharon Waite, and Mark Lovegrove volunteered to run everything related to food.

- i) We need someone to create signs for the food and bathrooms. Clyde is looking for something a little bit larger than we had last year. He will mention it at the club meeting to see if someone can handle that.
- ii) As far as parking is concerned, we need to make sure we have handicap parking spots available. The volunteers who are working parking need to make sure we charge \$5 for a table this year.
- iii) We need someone who has a drone and who is willing to take an aerial shot of the hamfest site after everything has been set up to see where the canopies are set up. The idea is to redo the laminated map that the parking attendants use to direct vendors to their spots.
- iv) Joe Urdzela is going to handle any talk-ins that we may receive on the repeater. Last year we had just a few who called in.
- v) Mike Holcomb is going to bring the PA system this year.
- vi) Last year, it was brought to our attention that a couple of people had cut themselves on our ticket drum. We decided that we needed to either replace the drum or fix the front face where people drop their tickets in with some kind of screen. Pete Strank/KC8TCS took the drum and will fix it for us
- vii) This years tickets will be the same colors as last year green for the vendors and yellow for general admission. Clyde will be filling out vendor tickets the night before for those vendors who have preregistered.
- viii)Ted Sadilek/WA8MFQ secured the callsign K8H to be used for the Special Event Station. Michael Boensch/W8MKB and Brian Wellwood/KD8ONC will be running the station.
 - (1) They plan to use a 90-ft antenna from Tennadyne on all HF bands.
- ix) Clyde would like to meet with everyone at 7pm the night before the hamfest to go over any last minute issues.
- x) Pete Strank/KC8TCS will allow us to use a couple of coffee carafs to hold the coffee and keep it hot throughout the event.
- xi) For prizes we have three radios (UV-5X3 Tribander, TYT-MD380 (Donated by Ham Radio 2.0), and a Yaesu FT-70DR.
 - (1) Other prizes are a couple antennas from MFJ, ARRL Gift Certificates (2-\$50 and 2-\$25), DX Engineering Gift Certificate (\$50), and 2-shirts from Ham Radio 2.0.
- xii) Clyde needs 200 more vendor tickets printed. Chris Ranes/NS8Q will order another set from Office Depot.

3) Motions:

- a) Russ Fitzgerald/N8FZ made a motion that we give Chris Ranes/NS8Q the green light to proceed with the tour project with a funding cap of \$600 for now.
 - i) Clyde Tompkins/K8CPT seconded the motion and the motion passes.

1) CALL TO ORDER:

- a) Club President Tom Rocheleau/WA8WPI called the meeting to order at 7:08 pm.
- b) Sam Fitzgerald/N8FPR held the flag for the Pledge of Allegiance.

2) ATTENDANCE:

a) 27 Members and 3 Visitors (Judy Brewer, Mary Tillitson, Eric Woodard/KE8IGK, and Tim Schuchaskie/KE8HIY).

3) NEW LICENSES AND UPGRADES: None

4) DX CONTACTS:

- a) John Winn/KE8CYC has been chasing Summits on the Air. He just received his 1,000th point and won a gift certificate, which he used to purchase a nice glass paperweight.
- b) Chris Ranes/NS8Q made contact with Moldova, Spain, Greece, Turkey, Guatemala, and French Polynesia.

5) APPROVAL OF REPORTS:

a) Due to unexpected computer hardware failure, we will postpone the approval of the Treasurer's and Secretary's Reports until next month.

6) FIELD DAY REPORT (Ron Harger/WD8BCS):

- a) The total amount of contacts this year were up for all stations. Both the CW and SSB stations had about 100 more contacts than what we had last year. We have 30 days until we have to have our log turned in. Ron will put together a spreadsheet showing the trends over the last ten years or so.
- b) Clyde Tompkins/K8CPT mentioned we made about fifteen contacts at the GOTA (Get On The Air) Station. Several people stopped by to operate the station, including a 7-year-old, who was the Grandson of Ken Faiver/W8HNI.
- c) Among those who operated were Dan and Dawn Beuchert's Daughter Abbey, as well as Dan Ruger's Daughter Reanna. Both girls had a really good time and are looking forward to next year's event.

7) CARDS & FLOWERS REPORT:

a) Cards were sent to Leota Strobel/KD8SQD and Dan Dembinski/KD8YDE.

8) HAMFEST UPDATE (Clyde Tompkins/K8CPT):

- a) Yaesu will officially be at this year's event and will be located inside the church building. They plan to put on three or four demonstrations during the Hamfest – showing off their Fusion line as well as some of their repeaters. The radio equipment they plan to bring will take up an entire 8-foot table.
- b) The official start time is 8 am, but all workers need to be there much earlier. Clyde wants to get together the night before at 7 pm to go over any last-minute details.
- c) For those of you who plan to load trailers, please be at the meet at the club room at 6 pm. All others who do not plan to load trailers can meet at the Hamfest site at 7 pm.
- d) Marc Lovegrove/KE8GQX said he would bring reflective vests for our volunteers to wear. CMARC owns some of their own, but the more we can get, the better.
- e) Tennadyne Antennas plans to be there as a vendor and is bringing an antenna for us to use at the Special Event Station (K8H).
- f) We are planning on several different prizes this year. There will be three different radios (UV-5X3 tribander, TYT-MD380 (Donated by Ham Radio 2.0), and a Yaesu FT-70DR. Other prizes are a couple of antennas from MFJ, ARRL Gift Certificates (2-\$50 and 2-\$25), DX Engineering Gift Certificate (\$50), and two shirts from Ham Radio 2.0.

- g) Dan Dembinski/KD8YDE will not be attending this year and bringing his pulled pork. This year we will have hamburgers, all-beef hot dogs, and brats.
- h) Tickets colors will remain the same as last year green for Vendors and yellow for the Public. All workers will get in free but will have to pay \$5 if they want to enter the raffle. All kids under 15 will get in free. They too will have to pay \$5 if they want to enter the raffle.
- i) If there are more vendors than spaces available in the parking lot the church gave us permission to move them back into the back yard.
- j) For all parking personnel if vendors need an extra table, the church has five or six tables they said we could use to rent out. We just need to make sure they are returned at the end of the event.
- k) We ask that all volunteers stay to help tear down, clean the restrooms and kitchen area, and take care of anything else that needs to be done. The more people we have, the quicker we can get out of there. In the past, the church leadership has always complimented us on how well we leave the building and the grounds when we are finished.
- I) All club members should park at the very back of the property along the tree line. Parking was limited last year for our guests and visitors.
- m) Michael Boensch/W8MKB has volunteered to make the Food and Restroom signs for us. We are looking for someone to build larger signs that we can place around the area to point the public to the Hamfest location.
- n) Pete Strank/KC8TCS asked his Dad to fix our ticket drum. Last year there were a couple of people who had cut themselves when dropping their ticket stubs inside.
- o) Kenny Hazlett/K8NNY will be the MC for the event. He is looking for a volunteer to help him out. Pete/KC8TCS volunteered to help.
- p) Larry Camp/WB8R will be there to represent the ARRL. Look for him by the announcer's booth.
- q) The site-wide simplex frequency for all workers is 146.520.
- r) All workers need to be full members for insurance reasons.
- s) Terry Lawson, the instructor for Speedway Gas Stations, will be with us to keep us legal with our Safe Server Food Licensing requirements.

9) TOWER PROJECT UPDATE (Tom Rocheleau/WA8WPI):

a) Ed Hude/WA8QJE called today and said the City of Mason has officially given us the approval to install our tower on the back side of our new building on Kerns Rd. The City stressed that they do not want any liability placed on them if the tower were to fall on MDOT property (the on-ramp to northbound 127) behind the large berm.

10) MICHIGAN STATE PARKS ON THE AIR:

- a) John Winn/KE8CYC has volunteered to organize any potential operations that CMARC is interested in conducting.
- b) He is checking into what it would take for us to sponsor Sleepy Hollow State Park.
- c) The State of Michigan will give us 500 QSL cards as well as the logs of those who made contacts with that particular park. We will need volunteers to stuff envelopes with the QSL card as well as other information provided by the State describing all about the State Park system.
- d) Sleepy Hollow State Park is only available for one year.
- e) Ropes or wire antennas are NOT allowed in the trees and are a ticket-able offense. The State is concerned about invasive species and damage to sensitive vegetation.

11) LABOR DAY PUBLIC SERVICE EVENT (John Tyree/KD8KCS):

a) John is looking for volunteers to help with the Race for CHUMM event again this year. It is located in Dansville and begins at 7 am. Further details will be available in a future Scope or by contacting John directly.
