

Our next training net is Monday September 13th at 7pm on the 145.39 LCDRA repeater. The training portion will be a review our most recent Emergency Management deployments, Skywarn Activations, and Upcoming Events.

Our next Monthly meeting is Monday September 20th and will be held on Zoom at 7pm. This meeting will include an LCDRA presentation and recap/debrief on our recent activations.



LCDRA Update

t the last CMARC meeting, Jeff Goeke-Smith KC8PUN gave an update about the current LCDRA situation regarding overall operations and the 145.39 machine in particular.

LCDRA is at a crossroads. There is the opportunity to move the 145.39 repeater back onto the WKAR tower in Okemos at a height of nearly 600 feet thanks to LCDRA president John Imeson N8JI. The 145.39 repeater was located at the WKAR tower until it was taken down during the installation of a new tower on the same site. It was quite expensive to transfer at the time and new agreements needed to be made with MSU Land Management. It has been installed on the Potterville tower for the last decade rent free and recently has only been operational due to the graces of the Eaton County Amateur Radio group. They have allowed LCDRA to use one of their antennas, taking the D-Star repeater offline, while LCDRA is investigating interference issues. Using separate antennas for receive and transmit reduces the interference.

This brings forward an exciting possibility coupled with a serious need. LCDRA has the permission to move its flagship repeater back to a prime spot at nearly 600 feet, adding to the already substantial footprint. This move, though, comes with some new costs. WKAR

owns the tower and requires all tenants to pay for power and carry insurance. Monthly bills have not been part of LCDRA finances or planning for at least the last 20 years. Current LCDRA membership dues would only cover about half of the projected cost of power and insurance. Even though LCDRA has the current funding to move to WKAR, it can not fund staying on the tower.

This means that we need you. LCDRA is in need of more members and LCDRA is in need of more funding. This being new territory, the Repeater Association is looking for new ways to help fund what could make a staple of the Mid-Michigan Amateur Radio community (the 145.39 repeater) more prominent for years to come. LCDRA operates repeaters that are open and free to use for public service events, Skywarn activations, and general amateur use. Because of this, LCDRA is asking for members to consider giving more, and non-members to consider joining. One-time gifts can help, smaller monthly gifts on a recurring basis could help even more. With enough sustained funding LCDRA can move forward on exciting projects to increase our local communication footprint.

Working DX That Your Friends Don't Hear

new II-year sunspot cycle is finally on the rise, and I've heard many comments about how nice it would be to work some DX stations again.

I have been fortunate to work many DX stations at the bottom of the cycle. Yet as a QRP (low pwr) operator, I'll also appreciate a few more spots on Ol' Sol. Hopefully making it a bit easier to snag that "rare one" on 15 and 10 meters.

Several of the DX Gang have questioned how I can work so many DX stations with just wire antennas up about 30-35 feet at the apex? Nothing special, just 2 trap dipoles. The 20. 40. 80 meter one runs East-West, so it favors the North-South. The 10, 15, 20 meter one runs North-South, so it favors the East-West paths. I have called other hams on the landline a few times to tell them to "listen up" for the DX station that I just worked, only to find they could not hear them at all.

I began to ponder the differences in our stations. Hmmm, what did I have that was so much better? First of all, the half-wave dipole at a reasonable height (I/4 to I/2 wavelength) is a VERY efficient antenna. Approaching 98% at resonance. But still just dipoles. Wire, insulators, and fed with about 75' of coaxial cable. So the other guys ????

Many had ground-mounted verticals. Some with very few radials. Not the most efficient antenna. Well, there was the first comparison in my favor. The vertical might get some better results by raising the feed point up above ground level. Say 8 to 10 feet. And, of course, any vertical will "play better" with more radials. I recommend a minimum of 4 per band, but the more, the better.

Many had lower dipoles and off-center fed aerials. (under 25 feet high) The quickest solution for these guys is to get them up in the air. Try to get the center of them up at

least 30 feet. 40 or 50 feet is even better if you have tall trees or finances for a tower. (the change in signals from 25' up to 35' up is dramatic!) Still, others had antenna setups near identical to my own. Some with even more wire length. These I had to "investigate" more carefully. One has a 40' tower and a G5RV. (102' all band dipole) One even had a 40-meter dipole up about 35' and fed with 70 feet of coax. Our stations are only a few miles apart. What was so different? I got down to the feedline. There's where I found the big difference. Most were using RG-58u or RG-8x, some using RG-8.

My station is using LMR600. "The good stuff." Yes, it's the most expensive part of my station. But with the "dB loss/ 100 feet" figures of RG-58u on 28Mcs compared to the LMR600, it's now easy to understand why these other guys aren't hearing the DX. It gets even worse as you go up to 6M, 2M, and beyond. Many times the DX stations are just above the noise level for me. If the other guys are losing a dB or 2 in their coax run, then, of course, they would never hear the DX.

The good coax is VERY pricey, but it's worth every penny in DX dividends. You spent hundreds if not thousands of \$\$ on your transceivers, power supplies, tuners, and other gear for your station. Are you gonna "cheap out" on the coax? Yes, I know. You may have to 2nd mortgage the house, or perhaps have the XYL get a 3rd job! Hee hee, But just Do It! While you're at it, get yourself a decent key too!

The DX awaits! ■

Operating notes: POTA Saves the Day

oday, I packed the /P station into the car and headed out to Port Huron's Pine Grove Park. One of the reasons for doing this was to activate the Lightship Huron, which is docked in the St. Clair River, very near where Lake Huron flows into the river. The Lightship Huron was the last operating lightship on the Great Lakes, and served for over 50 years when she was retired in 1970.

The second reason was to participate in the International Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend (ILLW). I've participated in this event several times. Last year, I operated from the Pointe aux Barques Lighthouse. The two years previous, I ventured over to Canada and joined the Elmira (ON) Radio Club (ERC) as they activated the Point Clark Lighthouse.

The third reason was to enjoy the company of members of the Eastern Michigan Amateur Radio Club, They just happened to be holding their annual picnic today.

It's an hour and a half drive from my home in Ann Arbor to Port Huron. I left home just after 9 am, got to Pine Grove Park, which is a beautiful park, by the way, a little after 10:30 am, and got set up by about 11 am, Pine Grove

Park has many tall trees, and it was quite easy to get my antenna up into one.

The weather conditions were perfect. It was sunny and in the low 80s, with a northeaster breeze coming off the lake. Unfortunately, the radio conditions were far from perfect.

Unlike my experience in the ILLW last year, I didn't make a single contact on 20m, despite hearing many strong European stations. They just couldn't hear me.

I had better success on 40m, but the CW portion of the band was pretty dead. I made 4 out of 7 contacts on phone, mirroring my experience a couple of weeks ago at the Pointe aux Barques Lighthouse. And, if it wasn't for POTA activators, I wouldn't have even made those four contacts. All four were activating parks. One was also activating a lighthouse, making that contact my only lighthouse-to-lighthouse contact of the day.

While I was disappointed that I didn't make more contacts, I still had a lot of fun. It was enjoyable being outside, and the folks from EMARC were great company. It's on my calendar to do this again next year.



Activating USA 615 again

ver the weekend, which just happened to be National Lighthouse and Lightship Weekend, I activated the Pointe aux Barque Lighthouse again. I've been up there several times before, and I never get tired of it. This weekend, I had one great day and one wet day.

On Saturday, I got up there a little before noon. After eating our lunch, I set up my KX-3 and doublet antenna and was on the air by I pm. This trip, I set up the antenna as an inverted vee, like I did in Afton, VA three weeks ago. That made the antenna a little easier to set up. Not only that, I made a perfect throw with my weighted tennis ball on the first try.

I thought I'd start out on 20 meters, and made my first contact with WoM, a special event station celebrating the bicentennial of Missouri as a state. That was the only contact I was to make on 20 meters, though. After a few unsuccessful calls, I decided to try 40 meters instead.

My first contact on 40 meters was another specials event station, KD3KA. KD3KA was commemorating the first professional baseball game radio broadcast made over KDKA on August 5, 1921, from Forbes Field in Pittsburgh.

I had a lot of success on 40 meters over the next couple of hours, working a couple of POTA stations and then another special event station, W8T. W8T was operating from the the World's Largest Teapot in Chester, WV.

One of the strange things of my outing this time is that I had more luck on phone than I did on CW, even though my output power was only 3 W. I actually made 7 phone contacts, versus 5 CW contacts.

While I was operating, the Pointe aux Barques Lighthouse Society was holding their annual Heritage Festival. At about 4:30 pm, everyone decided to pack it in for the day, so I followed suit. I packed up the radio, but left the antenna in the trees, intending to come back the next day.



Unfortunately, Sunday morning was a rainy one, and it didn't look like it was going to stop. Silvia and I drove over to the lighthouse from our hotel to eat lunch, and because it looked like it was going to continue to rain, I took the antenna down. My bad. The weather cleared up by 2 pm, and I could have gotten a couple more hours of operating in had I not taken down the antenna.

It wasn't a total loss, though. We went to the beach in Port Austin, and I got to take a dip in Lake Huron. ■


